Key Responsibilities

Supervises social work staff and provides an expert clinical social work service. Provides a consultancy service to staff within CAMHS and to other organisations in this specialised area of practice.

Brief Summary of Duties (in order of importance)

Coordination

- Plans, leads and coordinates social work service within Community Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS), including recruitment of social work staff in conjunction with the Service Manager.
- Provides orientation and training of new social work staff.
- Monitors social work service standards.
- Maintains responsibility for the implementation and evaluation of Performance Management for social work staff in conjunction with the Service Manager.
- Coordinates in-service training for social work staff.
- Represents social work on the Community CAMHS Management and Governance Committee Meetings.
- Liaises with tertiary institutions and coordinates placement of social work students.
- Reports to the Director of Community CAMHS on social work services and delivery.

Supervision, Consultation, Teaching and Research

- Provides professional and clinical supervision to social work staff.
- Provides specialist consultative support to colleagues and other professionals within CAMHS,
 Child and Adolescent Health Service (CAHS) and across the broader health system.
- Teaches colleagues and other professionals in specialist field(s).
- Consults on, develops and evaluates aspects of social work policy and practice in the area of child and adolescent health.
- Initiates and participates in research and evaluation in the area of Child and Adolescent Mental Health.

Clinical

- Provides an expert clinical social work service to disturbed children, adolescents and their families using a range of best practice interventions including family therapy, individual psychotherapy, parental counselling, group work and other social work interventions.
- Participates in multidisciplinary team meetings in which case management and intervention planning decisions are made.
- Undertakes community liaison for cases when complex negotiations are required, including general practitioners, paediatricians and psychiatrists.
- Evaluates clinical practice of evidence based treatment models through the effective utilisation of the National Outcomes and Casemix Collection (NOCC) measures.
- Ensures records and statistics are kept in accordance with established procedures.
- Manages workload in accordance with professional practice and standards and in accordance with social work principles and ethics.
- Participates in Performance Management Systems with line manager, regular supervision and professional development to develop and extend professional skills and knowledge.

CAHS Duties

- Responsible for ensuring, as far as practicable, the provision of a safe working environment in consultation with staff under their supervision.
- Performs duties in accordance with Government, WA Health, Child and Adolescent Health Service and Departmental/ Program Specific Policies and Procedures.
- Performs duties in line with the National Safety and Quality Health Services Standards and within best practice.
- Participates in a continual process to monitor, evaluate and improve patient safety and ensuring that services are family centred.
- Performs duties in accordance with the relevant Occupational Safety and Health and Equal Opportunity Legislation and WA Health Code of Conduct.
- Undertakes other duties as directed.

Work Related Requirements

Essential Selection Criteria

- 1. Tertiary qualifications in Social Work and eligible for full membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers or the Society of Professional Social Workers.
- 2. Demonstrated ability to function at a specialist level with effective leadership, organisational, facilitation and communication skills.
- 3. Demonstrated high level of effective functioning as a health professional in the context of a multidisciplinary team.
- 4. Demonstrated high level of professional knowledge and competencies in practices, methods and models and evidence based clinical interventions in children and adolescents with complex mental health disorders.
- 5. A high level of competence and extensive experience in professional supervision and performance development and management processes.
- 6. Demonstrated ability and experience in the implementation and evaluation of quality improvement activities specific to social work.
- 7. Extensive knowledge of the Mental Health Act 2014 and demonstrated ability to apply this in a clinical setting.
- 8. Current knowledge of legislative obligations for Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health, and how these impact on employment and service delivery.

Desirable Selection Criteria

- 1. Postgraduate training in health profession, leadership and management or other relevant qualification.
- 2. Research skills applicable to social work.
