Overview of Directorate

The Integrated Transport Planning Directorate provides strategic leadership within the Transport Portfolio by defining the form and function of the transport network for moving people and moving freight; by establishing infrastructure development priorities in the medium and long terms; by developing concept plans and integrated solutions for multi modal corridors; and, by developing and implementing integrated transport plans, planning policy and demand management strategies for major urban centres.



Overall Purpose of the Role

- Provides transport planning advice on statutory planning applications to ensure implementation of relevant transport planning measures and policies for sustainable transport outcomes.
- Reviews, analyses and prepares transport planning advice on proposals including development and subdivision applications, Scheme amendments and structure plans.
- Review, analyse and consult with key stakeholders to inform management in making key decisions on development applications and on projects.

Work Description

- 1 Contributes to a range of projects and studies in relation to the review and evaluation of transport planning advice and documentation.
- 2 Provides technical advice and assistance in the preparation of transport planning concept plans.
- Investigates, assists and provides support, with undertaking urban transport network and corridor planning and route development, including land reservation processes, with a focus on mobility corridors and activity networks.
- 4 Participates as a member of a multi-disciplinary team on major strategic network planning initiatives and priorities.
- Assists with reviewing and evaluating state and department transport policies and plans; develops new policies and recommends strategies for their implementation.
- 6 Coordinates, supports and assists with the maintenance of data storage systems, standards, processes and guidelines for the preparation of transport design concept plans.
- 7 Assists with the preparation of ministerial advice in the form of briefs and responses.
- 8 Liaises and attends meetings with staff of other government departments, local government, and the public regarding transport planning matters.
- 9 Liaises with team members, other departmental employees and other government agencies to ensure consistency of information and advice associated with integrated transport infrastructure.
- 10 Responds in an efficient and timely manner to requests for transport planning and design information from internal and external stakeholders.
- 11 Other duties as required.


ESSENTIAL:
