6.	Maintains excellence in interpersonal skills and use of leadership to guide appropriate patient care and service delivery. Maintaining strong communication with network of Nurse Coordinators - Palliative Care and Executive Nursing Teams within WACHS.		
7.	Promotes and facilitates a multi-disciplinary team approach to decision-making.		
8.	Develops innovative techniques for complex problem solving for palliative care services within the region.		
9.	Develops, implements and promotes evidence based standards and policies that are compliant with relevant professional, industrial and legislative requirements for the region.		
10.	Provide leadership in the coordination and implementation of quality improvement activities.		
11.	Contribute to the formulation of staffing profiles, according to analysis of clinical palliative care needs. Operate within the allocated / available budget for palliative care services.		
12.	Actively participate in the recruitment, selection and orientation of staff as required.
