

Performs an advanced clinical, consultant, education and research psychology service for CAMHS with individuals, couples, families, groups, other professionals, and organisational systems within a multidisciplinary and professional team context, and provides clinical supervision.

Participates in clinical governance for the regional CAMHS program, and facilitates interagency involvement and collaboration.

- Demonstrated proficiency in mental health clinical psychological assessment, therapy and interview techniques with children, adolescents and families including experience in systemic family therapy
- Thorough knowledge of research, evidence based theory, and clinical mental health practice applicable to children, adolescents and families
- Demonstrated ability to liaise effectively with other health professionals and external agencies both on 6. individual patient-management matters and on general service issues
- Well developed oral and written communication skills 7.
