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Brief Summary of Duties (in order of importance)

1. Clinical

- 1.1 This is a 12 month position based in Perth with the Koorliny Moort team and may require some research related interstate travel.
- 1.2 Manage Aboriginal children at general and developmental outpatient and outreach clinics under the supervision of specialists.
- 1.3 Manage acute and emergency presentations in Aboriginal children under the supervision of specialists.
- 1.4 Assist with inpatient and outpatient consultation service for Aboriginal children across WA.
- 1.5 Liaise with other relevant medical, nursing and allied health staff regarding patient management and care coordination.
- 1.6 Supervise and coordinate work of junior staff and other registrars in Aboriginal child health.
- 1.7 Contribute to training and teaching of students and health professionals in Aboriginal child health.
- 1.8 Assist with Aboriginal public health program and service development.
- 1.9 Assist with Aboriginal child health research and develop own research projects.
- 1.10 Attend and actively participate in hospital and research meetings and lectures.
- 1.11 Attend general paediatric, public health, developmental and community paediatric training sessions as directed by the ACH consultant paediatricians.
- 1.12 Perform additional duties as directed by the ACH consultant paediatricians.
- 1.13 Participate in team meetings.
- 1.14 Participation in Department of General Paediatrics and PMH / PCH after hours and on call rosters.

- 7. Commitment to the acquisition of knowledge, skills and attributes necessary to improve the health of Aboriginal children.
- 8. Demonstrated ability to communicate with Aboriginal families within a teaching hospital setting and in the wider community.
- 9. Ability to work in an interdisciplinary team and a commitment to a team approach on health issues.
- 10. Effective time management and organisation skills.
- 11. Excellent interpersonal, verbal and written communication skills.
- 12. Possession of or ability to gain a C or CA class drivers licence.
