- Please note: applicants are applying for entry into the RAPTOR program. Successful entry to the program will include employment with WACHS for the duration of the program.

- 2. Demonstrated commitment to working in a rural setting, with a strong interest in pursuing a rural physician career.
- 3. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively with patients, families, carers, colleagues and others involved in health services to provide high quality health care.
- 4. Demonstrated participation in continuing medical education activities to maintain up to date knowledge and skills.
- 5. Demonstrated organisational and time management skills to provide safe and timely patient-centred care.
