- Leads the strategic delivery of complex projects, ensuring alignment with departmental priorities through robust planning, risk management, resource coordination, and quality assurance of deliverables.
- Mentors and guides staff, fostering a work environment that empowers, motivates, and develops the diverse talents of individuals and teams.
- Manages team performance and workload distribution, ensuring timely delivery of strategic outputs with minimal oversight, while building capability and resilience.
- Leads stakeholder engagement and relationship management both internally and externally, including senior strategic committees and boards, to support policy development, program delivery, and change initiatives.
- Harnesses internal and external capability working with cross-functional teams, to define complex problems, set objectives, and recommend evidence-based, well-considered options.
- Operates with a high-level understanding of State Budget, Cabinet processes, State-Commonwealth bilateral arrangements, and inter-agency governance, applying this knowledge to influence decision-making and program delivery.
- Prepares high-quality advice and documentation, including ministerial briefings, Cabinet submissions, strategic reports, and policy papers for Corporate Executive, Ministers, and stakeholders.
- Drives the development of government and departmental policy, business planning, and procedures, ensuring alignment with strategic objectives and legislative frameworks.
- Represents the Department at senior-level forums, including interagency, State, and national
  consultations and negotiations, advocating for departmental interests and collaborative
  outcomes.
- Ensures compliance with public sector legislation, departmental policies, procedures, and delegated authorities, promoting clarity and accountability.
- Upholds and promotes ethical leadership, applying the Western Australian Public Sector Code of Ethics and the Department's Code of Conduct in all actions.



- Demonstrates strategic curiosity and agility, identifying emerging opportunities and adapting approaches to meet evolving departmental and community needs.
