About the program

The rotation system

The program operates on a rotational system that encourages graduates to be proactive, adaptable and open to the diverse career opportunities across the Department of Housing and Works. Each rotation lasts four months and is determined by a combination of business needs, qualification relevance, and individual career interests.

In 2025, our graduates worked alongside experienced professionals and senior staff on a variety of key projects including:

- supporting the delivery and maintenance of social and affordable housing across Western Australia
- contributing to projects such as delivering government office accommodation solutions, supporting fleet management initiatives (including the electric vehicle target), and improving internal communications and branding
- overseeing the construction and maintenance of major non-residential buildings including prisons, schools, hospitals and community facilities
- collaborating on housing policy, strategy, and planning in partnership with the private, government, and not-for-profit sectors
- enhancing effective Departmental operation through ICT support, organisational development and data analytics.
- assisting with the management of Government Regional Officer Housing (GROH) and housing asset portfolios

In each rotation, graduates have a documented workplan that outlines their placement objectives.

Support

Relationships are key to the success of our Graduate Program. Graduates are supported by senior management, supervisors, co-workers, buddies, graduate alumni, and a graduate consultant to ease the transition from study to a professional work environment.

Skill development and training

Diversity and the selection process
