# ROLE OF POSITION

The roleof thispositionistowork predominantlyunder supervisionas an effectivemember of the section team providing for the basic care, husbandry and healthmonitoring of a limited range of section taxa in the Perth Zoo collection. Proficiency and competencies are measured against the Zoo's Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), usually for a maximum of two different areas of Zoo 'rounds' Exposure and training on all rounds will occur as operationally required.
