- Represents the Department of Agriculture and Food on Committees and at forums, in matters relating to the inspectorate.
- Advises government bodies, industry and interested groups and individuals on animal welfare.
- Maintains accurate records and prepare reports, briefings and correspondence of both technical and non-technical nature.

- 3. Proven ability to maintain accurate records and prepare reports, briefings and correspondence of both technical and non-technical nature.
- 4. Relevant experience in interpreting and applying relevant Commonwealth and Western Australian legislation, codes of practice and standards.

Desirable Criteria

1. Preference will be given to applicants with qualifications in an approved discipline relevant to Animal Welfare, Regulatory and inspectorate duties.
