CONTEXT

The Statewide Services Division is responsible for the central portfolios that deliver support services to students and schools across the State to improve educational outcomes for all students. This includes closely collaborating with regions to ensure there is a state-wide integration of support to schools and students delivered through regional networks, providing policy advice, allocating resources, and monitoring programs and services to ensure high standards.

The Teaching and Learning Services Directorate is responsible for the delivery of integrated state-wide services for networks, schools and teachers supporting the learning and successful outcomes of all students. The services and support delivered through the Directorate are integrated with the Student Support Services Directorate, and all other functions of Statewide Services. This is achieved through a focus on better integration of services with schools, students, families and external service providers; supporting schools and networks of schools to deliver high-quality teaching and learning in every classroom; and creating expanded opportunities for students to develop academic, personal and social competencies they will need to participate in the future workforce and society.

The Road Safety and Drug Education Branch is a specialised centre of expertise delivering the School Drug Education and Road Aware Program (SDERA). SDERA is the State Government's primary strategy for road safety and drug education for young people. The program provides prevention education keeping children and young people safer. Program initiatives and resources target early childhood service providers and educators, school administrators, teachers, school support staff, parents/carers and the broader education community throughout Western Australia.

The SDERA program is designed to contribute to reducing road-related injuries and harms from alcohol and other drug use through education strategies and resources designed to build the capacity of teachers and schools to implement evidence-based school alcohol and other drug and road safety education programs.

ROLE

The Principal Consultant – Road Safety:

- leads, develops, implements and monitors road safety programs and resources to ensure that objectives, outcomes and outputs provide a whole school approach and are delivered in line with agreements, plans, school education programs and services relating to specific State and national strategic education programs and best practice
- provides leadership, strategic advice and support in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of road safety projects, programs, workshops, policies, guidelines and standards
- provides support, advice and information to schools, regional consultants and other key stakeholders on professional learning and education strategies across the provision of a range of road safety programs in partnerships with government agencies, non-government agencies and the not-for-profit sector in Western Australia
- proactively influences, negotiates, collaborates and liaises with school leaders, government agencies, non-government agencies and the not-for-profit sector in Western Australia in relation to developing partnerships, service arrangements, frameworks, structures and managing programs and projects
- undertakes research, analysis and planning to support the coordinator and monitoring of road safety programs, policies, guidelines and procedures
- coordinates and monitors projects and contracts for road safety initiatives and related programs, including budget and reporting
- prepares website content, newsletters, reports, briefing papers, responses to correspondence and other documentation for the Executive Director, Director General and the Minister
- investigates high-risk management issues and problems and identifies appropriate solutions
- represents Department on internal and external committees, advisory groups and working groups.

OUTCOMES

- 1. Professional consultancy, incorporating strategic and tactical advice, is provided to support SDERA programs and initiatives.
- 2. Policies, standards and procedures are developed and implemented to support activities.
- 3. High-level research is undertaken to identify emerging local, national and overseas trends and best practice related to the delivery of education and awareness services, programs, project, policies and initiatives.
- 4. Schools, principals, teachers and stakeholders are supported to implement programs and initiatives aimed at improving education and awareness outcomes relating to road safety.
- 5. Appropriate communication networks are established and maintained across the Division, within the Department and with external stakeholders.
- 6. The Department is represented on committees, advisory groups and working parties at State and national levels.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The following selection criteria are identified as being required to achieve the outcomes in the context of this position. Applicants will need to provide evidence of their capacity to transfer their knowledge and skills to achieving the outcomes of this position.

- 1. Demonstrated highly developed skills and experience in managing and implementing system-wide projects or programs in a large and complex organisation.
- 2. Demonstrated highly developed leadership skills with the ability to develop strategic directions in accordance with program objectives, visions and goals.
- 3. Demonstrated highly developed conceptual and analytical skills, including the ability to provide innovative solutions to strategic and complex problems and issues that inform decision-making.
- 4. Demonstrated highly developed written communication and presentation skills, including extensive experience in preparing policies, reports, briefings, general communication and responses to Ministerial requests.
- 5. Demonstrated highly developed oral and interpersonal skills, including the ability to undertake highlevel consultations, collaborations and negotiations and build high-level relationships, alliances and networks.
