

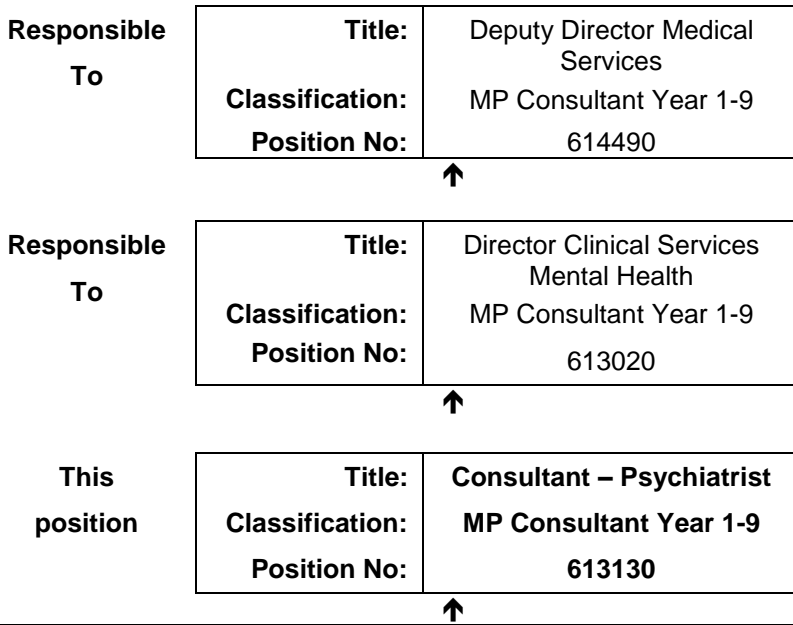

Section 3 – KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Accountable for the clinical management of adult patients (including families and carers) of the South West Mental Health Service as a member of the multidisciplinary team. Provides clinical services primarily to the Lower South West and Acute Psychiatric Unit, Bunbury Hospital, but to the whole region as required in agreement with the Clinical Director and Regional Mental Health Manager. Supervises work of junior medical staff.

ESSENTIAL

1. Fellowship of the RANZCP or RANZCP recognised equivalent specialist qualifications/recognition.
2. Eligible for full registration with the Medical Board of Australia as a specialist in psychiatry (or on a recognised pathway to specialist registration for overseas trained specialists),
3. Demonstrated significant clinical experience managing high acuity patients in an acute mental health setting
4. Knowledge and experience of working within the Western Australian Mental Health Act 2014 and other relevant mental health legislation (or equivalent other jurisdiction's Mental Health Act legislation)
5. Demonstrated ability to provide clinical leadership and work as part of a multidisciplinary team
6. Demonstrated ability to understand service strategic and operational requirements, and implement sustainable change to improve patient safety and reduce access blocks or delays in access to care
7. Demonstrated effective communication, interpersonal and conflict resolution skills, including the ability to represent the organisation externally
8. Demonstrated commitment to working closely with consumers and families to deliver recovery orientated and patient centred care
9. Experience in providing services to clients from diverse backgrounds, and demonstrated cultural competence skills
10. Demonstrated experience and ability to effectively supervise junior medical staff.
11. Current C or C-A Class driver's licence.
12. Current knowledge of legislative obligations for Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health and how these impact on employment and service delivery.
