

	Duties
1.0	CLINICAL
1.1	Provides direct clinical management to and in consultation with regional nursing and medical practitioners of
	patients via Emergency Telehealth Service (ETS). Clinical service is delivered remotely to patients by
	telemedicine (telephone and / or video conference) via sites located in Perth or elsewhere as agreed.
	Supervision, management and patient flow co-ordination of patients with urgent and life threatening conditions
	from all age groups, including multiple trauma. Service provision will need to be flexible and will vary
	dependent upon needs as determined appropriate for a 24- hour emergency service.
1.2	Participates fully in the 24-hour, 7 day a week Emergency Medicine Consultant ETS roster including night
	duty, weekends and on call as rostered.
1.3	Supports medical colleagues, nursing and the multidisciplinary team in the performance of their clinical duties.
1.4	Maintains quality patient medical records according to health service protocols ensuring that documentation and
	record keeping is accurate, accountable and in accordance with legislative and organisational requirements.
1.5	Liaises with members of the regional health care team – local nurses and General Practitioners (GPs),
	metropolitan health services and the private sector to meet the needs of patients under their care.
1.6	Other clinical duties include providing short stay / observation ward emergency medicine oversight where
	appropriate. Provides medical input and leadership into patient flow coordination as required.
2.0	CLINICAL ADMINISTRATION
2.1	Attends to EM clinical governance duties - for example following up results, issuance of medical including
	workers compensation certificates, completion of medico legal reports; involvement in clinical case conferences,
	clinical incident and complaint review and investigation.
2.2	Attends to medico legal issues that arise concerning patients that have been under their care and advises the
	relevant Medical Administrator about complaints and clinical incidents as directed.

2.3	Participate in committee meetings and special projects such as disaster planning, clinical pathway design, etc as
	directed.
3.0	EDUCATION
3.1	Develops and maintains the skills necessary to provide safe medical practice, including record of maintenance of
	professional standards, continued medical education and regular performance reviews.

Participates and assists in the continuing medical education/in service training of medical students, nursing and

	medical colleagues.
3.3	Acts as a role model, supervisor and mentor to doctors in training, nursing and medical colleagues during their placement as is appropriate.
3.4	Engages in continuing medical education and ensures retention, registration and Fellowship of the Australasian College for Emergency Medicine or equivalent.
3.5	Initiates, supports and participates in the ETS outreach Education program as well as research activities within the health service as is appropriate.
4.0	LEADERSHIP
4.1	Participates in clinical meetings, quality improvement and audit activities including the Morbidity, Mortality and Peer Review activities, the service's contribution to the Clinical Incident Management Policy (CIM) and other clinical governance activities as directed.
4.2	Participates in peer review and case review meetings and other quality assurance activities.
4.3	Supervision of medical colleagues and involvement in supervision of training positions and assessment of medical staff performance may be required.
5.0	OTHER
5.1	Other duties as directed.
