Key Responsibilities

As part of a multidisciplinary team provides and coordinates comprehensive Medical Imaging services to patients at an advanced practice level.

Practices as a Senior Medical Imaging Technologist and ensures practice is in accordance to the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia *Code of Conduct*, the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia Registration Standards and SMHS policies and guidelines.

Brief Summary of Duties (in order of importance)

1. Clinical (75%)

- 1.1 Interprets radiological requests and performs appropriate procedures in accordance with the Radiation Safety Act, other relevant legislation, hospital or departmental policies.
- 1.2 Undertakes clinical shifts at the direction of the Chief Medical Imaging Technologist including participation on the on-call/after-hours/weekend roster if required.
- 1.3 Ensures image quality and examination scope is sufficient to provide diagnostic information relevant to clinical needs.
- 1.4 Supervises fluoroscopy procedures performed by medical practitioners holding a limited fluoroscopy license.
- 1.5 Participates in maintenance and care of imaging and associated equipment.
- 1.6 Initiates, implements and participates in quality improvement and research activities in consultation with the Chief Medical Imaging Technologist to systematically evaluate service delivery and meet customer needs.
- 1.7 Supports and liaises with patients, carers, colleagues, medical, nursing, allied health, support staff, external agencies and the private sector to provide coordinated multidisciplinary care.
- 1.8 Completes clinical documentation and undertakes administrative tasks as required.
- 1.9 Participates in departmental and other meetings as required to meet organisational and service objectives.
- 1.10 Participates in ongoing evaluation of clinical practice.

2. Education/Training/Research (15%)

- 2.1. Engages in continuing professional development/education and ensures continuous registration with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia as per essential criterion 1.
- 2.2. Provides professional support, clinical orientation and supervision and direction to Medical Imaging staff, students and other clinical staff as required.
- 2.3. Develops and participates in evidence based clinical research activities where applicable.

3. SMHS Governance, Safety and Quality Requirements (10%)

- 3.1. Participates in the maintenance of a safe work environment.
- 3.2. Participates in an annual performance development review.
- 3.3 Supports the delivery of safe patient care and the consumers' experience including participation in continuous quality improvement activities in accordance with the requirements of the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards and other recognised health standards.
- 3.4. Completes mandatory training (including safety and quality training) as relevant to role.
- 3.5. Performs duties in accordance with Government, WA Health, South Metropolitan Health Service and Departmental / Program specific policies and procedures.
- 3.6. Abides by the WA Health Code of Conduct, Occupational Safety and Health legislation, the Disability Services Act and the Equal Opportunity Act.

4. Undertakes other duties as directed.

Work Related Requirements

Essential Selection Criteria

- 1. Tertiary qualifications in Medical Imaging and eligible for registration with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia and licensing with the Radiological Council of WA.
- 2. Demonstrated extensive experience and knowledge in radiographic and computed tomography principles, procedures and standards with competent adaption of techniques to suit non-routine situations.
- 3. Demonstrated ability to plan, develop, coordinate, implement and evaluate Medical Imaging services in relevant clinical areas including application of quality improvement principles and practices.
- 4. Demonstrated high level time management and organisational skills when planning, providing and monitoring Medical Imaging services within a designated caseload.
- 5. Demonstrated high level interpersonal, written and verbal communication skills.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to work effectively in a multidisciplinary team setting.

Desirable Selection Criteria

- 1. Completion or progress toward a relevant postgraduate qualification in a relevant clinical area.
- 2. Demonstrated knowledge of Quality Systems and Radiology Accreditation.
- 3. Demonstrated knowledge of PACS systems and system administration.
- 4. Current knowledge and commitment to Equal Opportunity in all aspects of employment and service delivery.

Appointment Prerequisites

Appointment is subject to:

- Evidence of current registration with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia and licensing with the Radiological Council of WA must be provided prior to commencement.
- Working With Children (WWC) Check, compulsory check for people who carry out childrelated work in Western Australia.
- Provision of the minimum identity proofing requirements.
- Successful Criminal Record Screening Clearance.
- Successful Pre-Employment Integrity Check.
- Successful Pre-Employment Health Assessment.
