

#### Section 3 – KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsible for the leadership of the multi-disciplinary team to provide comprehensive emergency services to patients of the Busselton Health Campus. Promotes patient quality and safety within the emergency department. Provides leadership, management, training, supervision and education for Senior Medical Practitioners in collaboration with the Director of Emergency Medicine (Busselton) and the Medical Administrator.

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The WA Country Health Service (WACHS) is the largest country health system in Australia and one of the biggest in the world, providing health services to over half a million people, including over 50,000 Aboriginal people, over a vast two and a half million square kilometres area.

WA Country Health Service hospitals handle almost as many births as the State's major maternity hospital – and 40% of the State's emergency presentations. The range of health services provided include acute inpatient and emergency care, population and public health, mental health, Aboriginal health, aged care and includes increasing number of services provided by telehealth video-conferencing.

- 6. Experience in rural area medicine.
- 7. Demonstrated experience in health IT design, reform and/or implementation.
- 8. Demonstrated commitment to the effective management of clinical risk and improving quality.
- 9. Current knowledge of legislative obligations for Equal Employment Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health, Freedom of Information and how these impact on employment and service delivery.
- 10. Eligible for / or in possession of a current C or C-A Class drivers licence.

#### DESIRABLE

- 1. Experience or qualifications in other specialist or procedural fields.
- 2. Substantial experience in emergency medicine research including study design, implementation, evaluation, presentation and publication.
- 3. Demonstrated participation and skills in medical education at all levels and across multiple disciplines, in particular FACEM Part 1 and 2.
- 4. Demonstrated experience and ability to foster strong relationships between general practice, emergency medicine and other stakeholders.
