

WA Country Health Service (WACHS) is seeking appoint a suitably experienced people to the position of District Medical Officer - Non-Procedural GP/ED to join the team in the Kimberly region. This is a Fixed Term Full Time appointment for up to 5 years, with the possibility of extension(s).

This role requires a medical practitioner who holds the College of Rural and Remote Medicine (FACRRM) or Fellow of the Royal Australian College of General Practice (FRACGP). Candidates must practise without clinical supervision, experience working with in Aboriginal health preferred. The successful applicant must demonstrate significant emergency department experience, with additional primary health care knowledge and skills. The position provides clinical service to the hospital of the Kimberley as well as outreach clinics in surrounding remote communities. This position reports to and is supported by the Senior Medical Officer at each site. The successful candidate will be rostered to clinical duties in the emergency department and/or GP clinics at each hospital as well as being rostered to a 1:3 on call roster.

The Locations

The Kimberley is Western Australia's most northern region, a coastline closer to South-East Asia than Perth. Bordered by the Pilbara region to the south and Northern Territory to the east, the 424,517 square kilometres region has fewer people per square kilometre than almost any other place on Earth. Internationally recognised for its unique and dramatic landscape, the region includes spectacular gorges, waterfalls and cave systems, and an astonishing variety of wildlife. Famous attractions include World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park and Mitchell Falls, and stunning El Questro Wilderness Park and Broome's Cable Beach. Characterised by its distinct wet and dry seasons, the Kimberley experiences a sub-tropical climate. May to October is the dry season, and November to April is the wet season.

 clinics and telephone support at Wyndham and Halls Creek Hospitals, Warman and Kalumburu
 communities.
- Wyndham is Australia's most northern town, 105km northwest of Kununurra. The hospital is a five inpatient facility and services a small population of 900.
