Key Responsibilities

Interpret radiological requests and perform appropriate procedures in accordance with the Radiation Safety Act, other relevant legislation, hospital or departmental policies and supervisor's instructions.



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Brief Summary of Duties (in order of importance)

1. Professional & Tutorial (30%)

- 1.1 Responsible for patient welfare, privacy and security during the examination.
- 1.2 Perform routine ultrasound examinations.
- 1.3 Evaluate the adequacy of the examination.
- 1.4 Assist the Radiologist with complex scanning techniques and interventional procedures.
- 1.5 Advise and consult on the prioritizing of bookings in line with clinical investigations.
- 1.6 Provides a resource and consultancy on techniques, reference material and equipment problems.
- 1.7 Evaluate new techniques and advises staff through monthly updates, revised protocols, ultrasound modules, journal circulation and additional material.
- 1.8 Conducts appraisals on trainees and reports to the Chief Medical Imaging Technologist and Head of Department.
- 1.9 Monitors quality assurance procedures for approved participants of the program and liaises with the Medical Imaging Technologists and radiological Registrars.
- 1.10 Evaluate and advise on new techniques and equipment with a view to introduction into the department.

2. Supervision (60%)

- 2.1 Assists in the supervision and training of Medical Imaging Technologists / Sonographers in the performance of ultrasound examinations and assist with the training of radiology Registrars.
- 2.2 Maintain records of ultrasound examination.
- 2.3 Responsible for ensuring, as far as practicable, the provision of a safe working environment in consultation with staff under supervision.

3. Maintenance (10%)

- 3.1 Maintains a quality control program of ultrasound equipment.
- 3.2 Ensures that the ultrasound equipment is in good working order and diagnose simple faults.
- 3.3 Liaise with BME personnel for repairs and servicing.
- 3.4 Evaluate and advise on new techniques and equipment with a view to introduction into the department.
