1.5	Provides general Outpatient and General Practitioner services at Karratha Hospital as required.		
1.6	Manages the care of patients admitted to Karratha Hospital, consulting with specialist Medical Practitioners as appropriate.		
1.7	Provides an on-call service to Karratha Hospital for inpatients and emergency department, including nights and weekends.		
1.8	Supports Nursing, Allied Health staff and Aboriginal Health Workers in delivery of health care.		
1.9	Supervises undergraduate and postgraduate medical staff as required.		
1.10	Ensures timely and legible completion of documentation including discharge summaries and medication orders.		
1.11	Perform clinics and provide services in remote area clinics.

2.7	Ensures adherence to WACHS Pilbara Corporate policies and procedures.		
2.8	Participates in performance development sessions conducted by SMO and provides current evidence of college Continuing Medical Education (CME).

8. A record of appropriate Emergency Department skill maintenance in the last triennium of completion of at least 1 of the following and evidence of continued professional development:
  - ACLS (or equivalent)
  - APLS (or equivalent)
  - EMST (or equivalent)
  - GCCA (or equivalent)
9. Demonstrated understanding and knowledge of the Aboriginal Cultural Respect Framework.
10. Evidence of a current C or C-A Class driver's licence.
