This includes provision of a visiting surgical service to Broome as well as other Kimberley sites, which will include spending nights away from home on a regular basis. Services include surgical consultations, operating, post-operative care and participation in multidisciplinary care of patients. Teaching and supervision of junior medical staff is required.
