Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. Strategic Leadership

- 1.1. Leads the management, facilitation, coordination and implementation of the WA Country Health Service (WACHS) outpatient reform program in alignment with WACHS strategic priorities and related health reform agenda.
- 1.2. Maintains knowledge and awareness of research, trends and issues in relation to outpatient service delivery and reform at the state and national level as well as broader functional areas including but not limited to digital health and rural health.
- 1.3. Participates in identification and leads the development of relevant organisational strategies in line with the outpatient reform agenda and health programs.
- 1.4. Creates and supports strong linkages with other program areas, initiatives, health services and stakeholders.
- 1.5. Acts as a subject matter expert within WACHS with respect to outpatient reform issues, strategies and data.
- 1.6. Represents WACHS strategic and operational priorities in state-wide outpatient reform initiatives and forums.
- 1.7. Delegates work to and supervises relevant staff and project team members as required.
- 1.8. Ensures meaningful regional consumer representation and engagement at all levels of outpatient reform agenda.

2. Program Management and Coordination

- 2.1. Leads, coordinates and manages WACHS outpatient reform agenda, projects, policy development, research activities, and planning processes including the preparation of reports, guidelines and submissions to address service needs and issues across WACHS.
- 2.2. Develops, implements and monitors WACHS outpatient governance framework that underpins and facilitates the reform priorities.
- 2.3. Investigates and analyses issues associated with relevant strategic initiatives, including risk management, budget and timeframe considerations.
- 2.4. Supports change management initiatives within WACHS relating to outcomes and initiatives within the outpatient reform agenda.
- 2.5. Adopts an outcome oriented approach to project management initiatives including planning, delivery and evaluation of person-centred services relevant to the program area.

3. Policy and Planning

- 3.1. Facilitates the review and evaluation of outpatient reform policy for WACHS.
- 3.2. Contributes to holistic organisational policy development, including consideration of the impact and implementation of policy.
- 3.3. Contributes to the organisation's strategic and operational direction which may include clinical planning.

4. Liaison and Information Management

- 4.1. Facilitates appropriate liaison and consultation with management, staff and other key stakeholders as required.
- 4.2. Liaises with necessary government and non-government organisations as required to support information gathering and research.
- 4.3. Prepares and disseminates regular reports and updates as required, including drafting briefing notes and ministerial responses etc.
- 4.4. Represents WACHS on a range of forums both internal and external to WACHS.
