Key role of this position

Construction Management

• Provides advice and support on construction management coordination, ensuring that construction activities meet required design and safety construction standards and specifications.







- Inspects and reports on site activities ensure that projects are completed to the approved construction standards, schedules, work safety requirements, designs and other requirements; inspecting and reviewing both safety and risk issues and reporting on non-conformances against required practices.
- Contributes to the development of policies, procedures, templates, models and other associated documentation in the construction and project management field.
- Monitors, reviews and identifies potential risks on safety management plans, inspection and test plans, providing input to contract/site meetings as required whilst developing and maintaining effective relationships with internal and external stakeholders to facilitate the safe development and delivery of projects.

Other

 Carries out other tasks and functions that are within the limits of the employee's skills, competence and training as required.
