Responsibilities of the position

- Identifies, acquires, cleans and prepares relevant data sources.
- Analyses data using statistical modelling, descriptive statistics and machine learning techniques to contribute to identifying data patterns and trends.
- Uses programming languages to develop pipelines and create models and data visualisation tools to prepare dashboards.
- Ensures data integrity by identifying problems and proposing solutions.
- Liaises with stakeholders to coordinate the visualisation and sharing of data.
- Supports data and information requirements for a number of strategy and performance reporting functions.
- Researches opportunities, supports projects and provides advice in relation to the use of analytics, databases, systems and other technologies to enhance data analysis and governance within the Commission and across the public sector.
- Provides contract management support as required.
- Researches and prepares reports, briefing notes, correspondence and other written material relevant to the outputs of the Branch and for a wide audience including Parliament, Ministers and Chief Executive Officers.
