CAHS comprises four service streams:



Neonatology

Our Neonatology Unit provides state-wide tertiary neonatal services to the sickest newborn babies and infants who are born preterm or who require specialist treatment in their first months of life.

Our Neonatal Units care for approximately 3,000 babies each year across two sites - King Edward Memorial Hospital (Subiaco) and Perth Children's Hospital (Nedlands) and have advanced life support equipment and a team of highly skilled specialist medical and nursing staff.

The CAHS Neonatology Unit includes two NICUs, Special Care Nurseries, the Newborn Emergency Transport Service (NETS), the Perron Rotary Express Milk Bank (PREM Bank), Centre for Neonatal Research and Education and the Neonatal Follow-up Program.



Community Health

Community Health provides health and developmental assessments, early intervention and health promotion services for children and young people. These services are provided at over 160 sites in the community across the Perth metropolitan area including community health centres, schools, at home visits and through telehealth appointments. Services focus on child health, growth and development, behaviour, immunisation and supporting families. We also work to improve the lives of future West Australian children through research.



Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS)

CAMHS provides important and specialised mental health services to children, young people and their families across the Perth metropolitan area. Services include community based programs focused on complex attention and hyperactivity disorder, multisystemic therapies, pathways for complex mental health in 6 to 12 year old's, day programs to support 12 to 17 year old's struggling with self-harm, an eating disorders service and gender diversity service. PCH also has Western Australia's only public paediatric mental health inpatient unit.



Perth Children's Hospital

Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) is WA's dedicated paediatric hospital and provides tertiary services for the entire State, caring for children up to 16 years of age. The hospital provides inpatient, ambulatory and outpatient services and is the home of WA's only paediatric trauma centre. Purpose built and comprising 298 beds, 75% of which are single occupancy, PCH provides treatment and care for the most serious medical cases, as well as secondary services including inpatient, outpatient and same day care. PCH has 12 multi-use operating theatres, two interventional theatres and an intraoperative MRI. It is a centre of excellence for teaching and research, partnering with the Telethon Kids Institute (TKI) and the State's universities. PCH has become the global hub for research into type 1 diabetes in children as well as rare and undiagnosed diseases.

Employee benefits

Benefits at a glance

At CAHS, employees are our most valued asset. Just as we're committed to providing the safest and highest quality of healthcare, we are also committed to providing outstanding benefits to our employees that include:

- flexible and family friendly working arrangements including part-time, job share or casual employment, telecommuting and hybrid work, breastfeeding breaks
- generous allowances including qualification allowance, on-call allowance, study, and various shift penalties
- leave benefits including paid personal leave, 13 weeks long service leave for every 10 years of continuous service followed by 7 years as per the relevant industrial agreement
- 4 weeks paid annual leave plus an additional 3.5 days in lieu of leave loading, additional leave and leave in lieu of public holidays for shift workers
- 12 accrued days off (ADOs) per annum in additional to other leave
- deferred salary scheme or phased retirement scheme and provision to purchase additional leave
- opportunities for career growth and personal development
- employee recognition and rewards programs
- professional development opportunities and access to leave for education, training and research
- superannuation of 10.5% contributed by employer into a fund of your choice
- modern and comfortable uniforms.

Salary packaging

Access to salary packaging arrangements including Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) concessional benefits up to a maximum grossed up taxable value of \$17,000 per year. CAHS employees may use this cap to package items such as general living expenses, mortgage repayments, rent and credit card payments.

Corporate rates on health insurance

CAHS employees and their families have access to corporate rates for health insurance with several providers.

Support for employees

CAHS employees and their families have 24/7 access to an Employee Assistance Program for free confidential counselling both for personal and work related matters as well as access to staff wellness programs and onsite support.
