Role summary

Leads a team of Biosecurity Officers to ensure program plans and responses are successfully implemented to identify, prevent and respond to biosecurity risks and maintain high standards of animal welfare and product integrity in Western Australia. Leads projects or portfolios to develop organisational capacity in specific areas.

Works to protect Western Australia's economy, environment, and people by preventing or managing risk from pests and diseases that impact animals, plants, and the aquatic and terrestrial environments.

Coordinates provision of technical knowledge and on-ground presence to manage and protect our agriculture and aquatic resources and strengthen WA's biosecurity status.

About us

Key responsibilities

The key responsibilities of the role include, but are not limited to, the following:

Biosecurity

- Coordinates a team of Biosecurity Officers to undertake and report on biosecurity surveillance, control and eradication activities in accordance with the requirements of program plans, policies, legislation and standard operating procedures.
- Undertakes regulatory activities, including investigation of suspected non-compliance and conduct of enforcement activities, under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007 and other Acts and Regulations*.
- Plans and coordinates staff and resources during the delivery of biosecurity and animal welfare emergency responses and lead local emergency response activities.
- Investigates and reviews reports on biosecurity, animal welfare and product integrity incidents and assists in the identification, analysis and response to causal factors to manage the incident and to minimise the risks of repeated incidents.

- Works collaboratively with stakeholders to provide timely and accurate advice on relevant biosecurity, animal welfare and product integrity legislation, policies and practices.
- Supports other operational teams to effectively deliver operational outcomes, identify and resolve problems and contribute to the development and implementation of best practice in operations.
- Coordinates a portfolio of work or projects to develop organisational capacity or capability or to provide oversight to an operational project.
- Provides and reviews advice to Branch management on technical and operational issues.
- Provides input into the development of policies, standard operating procedures and plans to deliver on program objectives.
- Ensures high standards of data management and record keeping are maintained during operational activities.
- Performs any other assigned duties at the classification level that are within the employee's competence and training.
- Provides biosecurity extension and advice to producers, industry and community groups as required.
- Negotiates and consults with stakeholders to promote best practice biosecurity, animal welfare and product integrity.
- Participates in and coordinates emergency response activities as required.
- Performs other duties as required.

Work related requirements

Essential criteria

Role specific

- 1. Demonstrated experience leading teams that deliver regulatory outcomes including developing standard operating procedure and work instructions to enable consistent delivery of regulatory and inspection activities.
- 2. Well-developed knowledge of primary and/or regional industries and building relationships with industry stakeholders.

Core capabilities

- 3. *Build effective relationships:* Well developed workplace communication skills including written, verbal, interpersonal, negotiation skills and the ability to develop and maintain productive working relationships.
- 4. *Challenge for innovation:* Highly developed analytical and problems solving skills, including a demonstrated ability to develop innovative solutions to complex problems in order to meet organisational objectives.
- 5. *Think strategically:* Demonstrated ability to interpret and apply complex legislation and the ability to research complex issues and make appropriate recommendations.

- 6. *Deliver in a changing environment:* Demonstrated well-developed time management skills with the ability to plan, prioritise, deliver outcomes within agreed timeframes and respond effectively to change.
- 7. *Lead and empower others*: Proven experience in initiating and implementing strategies independently, and leading teams to achieve business outcomes

Desirable criteria
