The opportunity to get involved at the ground level of the transformation is unique, with a bottom-up approach in system re-design informing the development of new infrastructure, such as a re-furbished emergency department, critical care services, theatre complex and general ward areas, along with new medical and surgical assessment units, and outpatient areas.

Bunbury Regional Hospital is the largest hospital in the WA Country Health Service (WACHS), and is the major referral hospital for the south-west land division, home to over 170,000 people.

The hospital has a busy 24-hr emergency department, intensive care unit, general medical and general surgical wards, paediatric ward, obstetric service, comprehensive general medical and geriatric service, acute psychiatric unit, theatre complex and outpatient areas.

Bunbury Regional Hospital is co-located at the South West Health Campus with St John of God Bunbury private hospital, sharing a common ED, theatre complex and support facilities. This partnership offers many unique opportunities in a rural location.

Bunbury Regional Hospital Operating Theatre is the busiest theatre department in the South West region. As an operating theatre nurse in this department you will be supported to provide excellent, high quality and safe care within a multi-disciplinary team environment. There are three theatres that run currently with surgical specialties that include:

- General Surgery
- Orthopaedics
- Urology
- Obstetrics and Gynaecology
- Endoscopies/Bronchoscopies
- Trauma/ Emergencies.

The Acute Pain Service (APS) and the Peripherally Inserted Central Catheter (PICC) service are also provided through the Anaesthetic Department.

Bunbury Hospital provides a working environment that embraces professional

development with a new Transition To Specialty program, a six-month comprehensive introduction to peri-operative nursing regardless of your prior nursing experience, in addition to further education opportunities and upskilling for acute care nursing in the Post Anaesthetic Care Unit.

The training package we offer builds your capabilities and enhances your knowledge while expanding roles within the various specialities in the peri-operative environment.

For tertiary education, there is a TAFE campus offering courses in a wide range of industry areas, as well as the Edith Cowan University (ECU) Bunbury campus.
