Brief Summary of Duties (in order of importance)

1. Clinical

- 1.1. Interprets radiological requests and performs appropriate procedures in accordance with the Radiation Safety Act, other relevant legislation, hospital or departmental policies.
- 1.2. Undertakes clinical shifts at the direction of the Chief Medical Imaging Technologist/ Manager/Supervisor/Senior Medical Imaging Technologist including participation on the oncall/after hours/weekend roster if required.
- 1.3. Ensures image quality and examination scope is sufficient to provide diagnostic information relevant to clinical needs.
- 1.4. Supervises fluoroscopy procedures performed by medical practitioners holding a limited fluoroscopy license.
- 1.5. Participates in maintenance and care of imaging and associated equipment.
- 1.6. Supports and liaises with patients, carers, colleagues, medical, nursing, allied health, support staff, external agencies and the private sector to provide coordinated multidisciplinary care.
- 1.7. Completes clinical documentation and undertakes administrative tasks as required.
- 1.8. Participates in departmental and other meetings as required to meet organisational and service objectives.
- 1.9. Participates in ongoing evaluation of clinical practice

2. Education/Training/Research

- 2.1. Engages in continuing professional development/education and ensures continuous registration with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia as per essential criterion 1.
- 2.2. Participates in supervision, professional development and clinical consultation activities with supervising senior staff.
- 2.3. Assists with supervision and development of students and others as directed by senior staff.
- 2.4. Develops and participates in evidence based clinical research activities where applicable.

3. SMHS Governance, Safety and Quality Requirements

- 3.1. Participates in the maintenance of a safe work environment.
- 3.2. Participates in an annual performance development review.
- 3.3. Supports the delivery of safe patient care and the consumers' experience including participation in continuous quality improvement activities in accordance with the requirements of the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards and other recognised health standards.
