1.1	Participates in the management and coordination of pharmaceutical services within the region, including planning, coordination, visiting and evaluation of services, in conjunction with the Regional Chief Pharmacist and Chief Pharmacist.		
1.2	Participates in the formulation and implementation of all policies and procedures relating to pharmaceutical services for the region.		
1.3	Responsible for compliance with legal requirements regulating the profession of pharmacy and the control and distribution of pharmaceutical products, and the appropriate liaison with the governing authority administering those laws.		
1.4	Promote and lead a culture of research, quality improvement and innovation to drive reforms in pharmacy services which deliver better health outcomes for patients and which ensure compliance with the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards.		
1.5	Develops, implements, monitors and participates in drug utilisation evaluation, quality assurance and improvement activities and research activities relevant to pharmacy services as required and in collaboration with the Regional Chief Pharmacist and Chief Pharmacist.		
1.6	Assists as a contact person for all medicines management matters in the region.		
1.7	Assists in the supervision and training of pharmacy staff, students graduates and undergraduates and is responsible for the training of staff internal and external to pharmacy.

2.1	Provides clinical pharmacy services at an advanced practice level to patients within the region.		
2.2	Responsible for facilitating completion of the medication history and reconciliation process for all high-risk patients.		
2.3	Participates in ward/clinic medication rounds providing professional pharmacy advice to medical, nursing and allied health staff regarding the patients' medication profile.		
2.4	Provides medication counselling and drug information to patients, including assisting medical staff in the provision of a medication summary where available and the transition of the patient to the community setting.		
2.5	Ensures prescribing of all medications conforms to legal and professional requirements.		
2.6	Acts as a specialist clinical resource to pharmacy and other staff within the region.		
2.7	Controls the correct supply, handling, storage, and administration of drugs in clinical areas by advising nursing staff on the proper handling, security and administration of drugs and supporting the Pharmacy in the evaluation of ward imprest lists.		
2.8	Dispenses prescriptions showing due regard for the problems of drug disposition, interactions, adverse reactions, toxicity, dosage, formulation, patient compliance and cost.		
2.9	Assists with the ordering, receipt, stock control, issue and dispensing of drugs as per Hospital requirements.		
2.10	Completes daily review of all admitted patients including clinical documentation and undertakes administrative tasks as required.		
2.11	Promotes staff development programs and coordinates in-service training.
