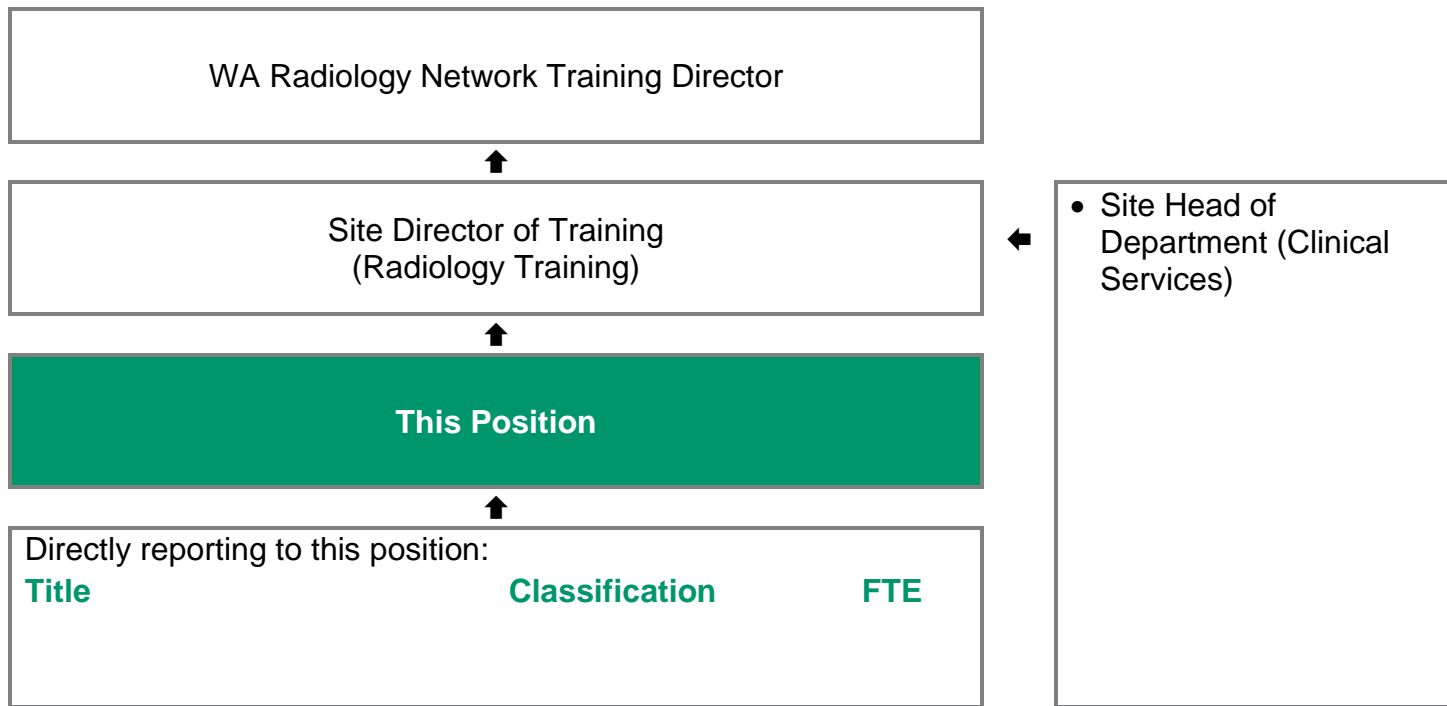

Brief Summary of Duties (in order of importance)

- The position is accredited by the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Radiologists (RANZCR) as a training position on the WA Radiology Training Program. The successful candidate will rotate through terms at the teaching hospitals and private practices accredited by that program, including regional and rural training sites.
- Undertakes inpatient and outpatient diagnostic imaging reporting as instructed and supervised by a Radiology Consultant.
- Undertakes diagnostic imaging procedures.
- Performs interventional procedures under the supervision and instruction of a Radiology Consultant.
- Participates in departmental meetings, teaching, including the weekly lecture series and journal club.
- Meets the learning objects and experiential requirements outlined in the RANZCR curriculum.
- Participates in quality assurance projects and implements strategies which will contribute to the assessment and improvement of departmental services.
- Participates in professional teaching activities, including the teaching of medical students, nurses, allied health staff and trainee medical staff.
- Participates in ongoing active research projects in diagnostic and interventional medical imaging.
- Assists in providing an on-call and emergency diagnostic and interventional medical imaging service.

1. Quality Assurance / Performance Management

- Participate in departmental quality assurance activities and data collection.
- Participate in a continuous process to monitor, evaluate and develop own performance.

2. EMHS Governance, Safety and Quality Requirements

- Participates in an annual performance development review.
- Supports the delivery of safe patient care and the consumers' experience including participation in continuous quality improvement activities in accordance with the requirements of the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards and other recognised health standards.

Work Related Requirements

Essential Selection Criteria

1. Eligible for registration by the Medical Board of Australia.
2. Minimum of two years clinical experience post-graduation, with demonstrated appropriate knowledge, skills and ability to commence training in Radiology.
3. Demonstrated dedication to pursuing a career in Radiology and an understanding of the radiologists' role and contribution to clinical practice.
4. Demonstrated high level of interpersonal communication skills including a high level of oral and written skills and ability to work and liaise with other health professionals.
5. Demonstrated high level of academic performance and evidence of other personal achievements.
6. Demonstrated high level of organisational and time management skills.
7. Current knowledge of legislative obligations for Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health, and how these impact on employment and service delivery.

Desirable Selection Criteria

1. Demonstrated good common routine procedural skills.
2. Shows personal commitment to Continuing Professional Education and Development.
3. An interest in and a commitment to teaching and research in Radiology and its related disciplines.
4. Interest in modern information technology as related to quality and best practice in Radiology.
5. Experience in working within multidisciplinary teams.

Appointment Prerequisites

- Evidence of registration by the Medical Board of Australia must be provided prior to commencement.
- Working with Children (WWC) Check, compulsory check for people who carry out child-related work in Western Australia.
- Provision of the minimum identity proofing requirements
