

Position Overview

Undertakes duties and responsibilities of a Medical Imaging Technologist in a relieving capacity across the WA Country Health Service and Metropolitan Health Service. Participates in the after-hours service delivery within a medical imaging department.

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Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. Professional

- 1.1. Undertakes duties and responsibilities of a Medical Imaging Technologist in a relieving capacity across multiple sites in the WA Country Health Service and metropolitan public hospitals.
- 1.2. Performs general, specialised mobile, theatre and CT medical imaging examinations as requested by Registered Medical Practitioners and other practitioners approved by the Radiological Council.
- 1.3. Assists Radiologist with special procedures, fluoroscopy and ultrasound as required.
- 1.4. Ensures privacy, safety and welfare of patients at all times while ensuring best quality examination is performed.
- 1.5. Liaises with medical staff and other Hospital staff regarding patient welfare and procedures.
- 1.6. Ensures compliance with Hospital and Department of Health WA, policies and guidelines.
- 1.7. Ensures compliance with the requirements of the Radiation Safety Act 1973 and Regulations 1983 as amended.
- 1.8. Records all medical imaging procedures performed and input data into Radiology information systems.
- 1.9. Monitors performance and improve techniques.
- 1.10. Undertakes performance development.
- 1.11. Participates in an approved Continuing Professional development program.
- 1.12. Participates in RANZCR/NATA accreditation processes.

2. Technical

- 2.1. Assists with the patient preparation.
- 2.2. Assists with quality assurance of fault reporting on; DR units, CR units, CT, laser printer and ultrasound equipment.
- 2.3. Monitors equipment performance and reports faults.

3. Other

- 3.1. Participate in shift and 'after hours' roster for general, specialist and CT medical imaging.
- 3.2. Perform other related duties as required by supervising MIT, or Health Science Manager in the absence of a supervising MIT.
- 3.3. Other duties as required.



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Work Related Requirements

The following criteria are to be read together with the Brief Summary of Duties and considered in the context of the WACHS Values.

Essential

- 1. Tertiary qualification in Medical Imaging and eligible for registration with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia and licensing with the Radiological Council of WA.
- 2. Awareness/appreciation of patient care procedures.
- 3. Knowledge of radiation protection procedures and radiation legislative dose limits.
- 4. Knowledge of radiographic quality control procedures.
- 5. Demonstrated communication skills with all levels of service delivery staff.
- 6. Commitment to continuing Professional Development Program.
- 7. Demonstrated skills in time management.

Desirable

- 1. Current knowledge of legislative obligations for Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health, and how these impact on employment and service delivery.
- 2. Demonstrated experience in Computer Tomography or willingness to train.
- 3. Willingness to participate in the Country Ultrasound Training Program.

Appointment Pre-requisites

Appointment is subject to:

- Evidence of current registration with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia and licensing with the Radiological Council of WA must be provided prior to commencement.
- Provision of the minimum identity proofing requirements
- Successful Criminal Record Screening Clearance
- Successful Pre-Employment Health Assessment
- Successful WA Health Integrity Check
- Successful Working With Children Check
- Evidence of a current C or C-A Class driver's licence or other specialised licence class
