Role summary

Under general direction provides high level technical support across a range of technical areas, to projects, operations and senior officers in the areas of field or laboratory research. Oversees junior staff undertaking technical activities.

Key responsibilities

The key responsibilities of the role include, but are not limited to, the following:

Research and Development

- Provides technical support to scientists in field, glasshouse and laboratory experiments by carrying out experimental, survey, sampling and analytical tasks.
- Records, tabulates, and checks research and surveys.
- Follows procedures, prepares non-routine samples for non-routine laboratory quality testing.
- Assists with the collation, analysis and preparation of non-routine research and survey reports.
- Undertakes maintenance of laboratory and experimental equipment used in research projects.
- Operates and maintains agricultural machinery and assists maintenance of experimental equipment.

Communication and Liaison

- Maintains and develops networks with staff across DPIRD and is developing relationships with stakeholders, community and industry groups.
- Supports communication and industry development activities by presenting on the application of established technical practices.
- Arranges meetings, field days and demonstrations as required.

- Attends to customer enquiries on a range of specialised technical inspection matters.
- Resolves customer grievances on a range of specialised technical and inspection matters according to policy and procedure, and escalates exceptional cases.

General

- Assists with the supervision and training of Technical Officers and casual staff as required.
- Assists in the preparation of cost estimates for different components of the research, diagnostic, inspection and extension activities and, orders supplies and equipment, as required.
- Participates in the implementation and evaluation of procedures and operations.
- Works with pesticides and other hazardous substances in accordance with standard safety procedures and guidelines.
- Undertakes emergency response duties as required.
- Other duties as required.

1. Demonstrated knowledge and expertise in the use of agricultural practices, research techniques and methods.

- 4. *Think strategically:* Ability to apply effective conceptual, analytical and problem solving skills to resolve identified issues.
- 5. *Deliver in a changing environment:* Demonstrated initiative and sound organisational skills including the ability to identify priorities and deliver outcomes.
- 6. *Lead and empower others:* Proven ability to work autonomously and in a team environment.

Desirable criteria

1. Bachelor degree in relevant discipline or equivalent experience.

Special requirements/equipment

- Diploma in a relevant discipline with relevant practical experience or substantial relevant experience.
- Undertaking field work away from the base location for periods up to a working week may be required.
- Working outside normal hours to complete seasonal tasks may be required.
- Living in regional/semi-remote community may be required.
- An acceptable National Police Certificate (police clearance), or equivalent may be required for identified positions (if not currently help, must be acquired prior to commencement at applicants expense).
- A current and valid Western Australian "C" class (car) drivers' license or equivalent is required (if not currently held must be acquired prior to commencement at applicant's expense).
