Our Services

CAHS comprises four service streams:

Neonatology

Our neonatology service providies state-wide tertiary services to the most unwell newborn babies and infants in Western Australia. Based at King Edward Memorial Hospital (KEMH) in Subiaco as well as onsite at Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) in Nedlands, CAHS has two Neonatal Intensive Care Units and Special Care Nurseries. Neonates also operates the Neonatal Emergency Transfer Service across the State of Western Australia, the Perron Rotary Express Milk Bank (PREM), outpatient and follow up programs and, is the Centre for Neonatal Research and Education.

Community Health

A comprehensive range of community based early identification and intervention services, as well as health promotion, to children and families in the Perth metropolitan area is provided by Community Health. Services are delivered in a variety of settings including at home, local community health centres, child and parent centres and schools. Community Health is focused on child health assessment, screening, immunisation, support, and advice to new born children, children with developmental delay, Aboriginal families, refugee families and families requiring additional support.

Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS)

CAMHS provides important and specialised mental health services to children and young people and their families across the Perth metropolitan area. Services include community based programs focused on complex attention and hyperactivity disorder, multisystemic therapies, Pathways for complex mental health in 6 to 12 year old's, day programs to support 12 – 17 year old's struggling with self-harm, an eating disorders service and gender diversity service. PCH also has Western Australia's only public paediatric mental health inpatient unit.

Perth Children's Hospital

Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) is the specialist state-wide paediatric and trauma centre for Western Australia, caring for children up to 16 years of age. PCH is also a centre of excellence for teaching and research, partnering in major paediatric research and education initiatives led by the Telethon Kids Institute (TKI) and the State's Universities. Purpose built and comprising of 298 beds, 75% of which are single occupancy, PCH provides treatment for the most serious medical cases, as well as secondary services, including inpatient, outpatient and day stay care. PCH contains 12 multi use operating theatres, an interoperative MRI and two interventional theatres.

CAHS provides a fantastic work environment and promotes a safe workplace that is inclusive, innovative, and service driven, where our shared values and vision set the standard for our personal behaviours, actions, and decisions.

Employee Benefits

- Flexible and Family Friendly working arrangements including part-time, or job share employment, casual employment, telecommuting and hybrid work, breastfeeding breaks.
- Generous allowances including qualification allowance, on-call allowance, study, and various shift penalties.
- Leave benefits including paid personal leave, 13 weeks long service leave for every 10 years of continuous service followed by 7 years as per the relevant industrial agreement.
- 4 weeks paid annual leave plus an additional 3.5 days in lieu of leave loading, additional leave and leave in lieu of Public Holidays for shift workers
- 12 accrued days off (ADO's) per annum in additional to other leave.
- Deferred salary scheme or phased retirement scheme and provision to purchase additional leave.
- Opportunities for career growth and personal development.
- Employee recognition and rewards programs
- Professional development opportunities and access to leave for education, training, and research.
- Superannuation of 10% contributed by employer into a fund of your choice.
- Uniforms that reflect the colour of the WA sky blue.

Salary Packaging

Access to salary packaging arrangements including Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) concessional benefits up to a maximum grossed up taxable value of \$17,000 per year. CAHS employees may use this cap to package items such as general living expenses, mortgage repayments, rent and credit card payments.
