KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Co-ordinate investigations, recommend, review and implement relevant policies, guidelines and practices that facilitate the safe and efficient use of the road and shared path network throughout Western Australia.

KEY DELIVERIES

Traffic Services

- Co-ordinate investigations, review and responses to traffic efficiency and road safety queries and requests relating to traffic signals, signage and pavement markings.
- Interpret and guide the implementation of Western Australian road and traffic legislative requirements.
- Provide specialist advice on options and/or solutions for road safety and efficiency improvements.
- Review and approve non-regulatory signage and pavement marking.
- Review and recommend regulatory approvals for signs, pavement marking and traffic signals.
- Develop and co-ordinate the delivery of minor improvement works.
- Co-ordinate the implementation of pavement markings and signs on the road network and accurate maintenance of records and databases for advertising, tourist, service and guide signs on the road network.
- Co-ordinate the provision of traffic services information and advice to stakeholders ensuring the consistent interpretation and implementation of Main Roads' regulations, policy and guidelines.
- Co-ordinate the identification of safety and efficiency deficiencies on the road network and provide solutions for inclusion into Main Roads' programs.
- Co-ordinate and/or review traffic models using industry standard software and recommend the most suitable model for implementation.
- Co-ordinate review of Development Applications (DAs) for traffic and safety issues.

Leadership and Management

- Co-ordinate a team of Traffic Services Officers and consultants to achieve agreed goals and objectives that meet the needs of various stakeholders and the public.
- Provide technical input to the development and improvement of Traffic Management Services policies and guidelines.
- Provide technical input to the development and deployment of relevant Austroads and Australian Standards for traffic management.
- Manage financial, technological, physical and other resources within agreed allocations to meet agreed outcomes.
- Manage employee behaviour, performance and development.

Stakeholder Relationships

- Build and enhance professional working relationships with internal and external stakeholders.
- Provide technical advice to State and Local Government, other agencies and traffic engineering professionals on traffic engineering and road safety practices.
- Provide advice and prepare responses to ministerial/media enquiries, and community matters.
- Represent Main Roads on traffic and safety matters and practices.
