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3. Role and Scope

Administration Assistant

Supervisor Veterinary Nurse

This is a brief outline of the key responsibilities and scope. Scope may include the level of guidance under which the job operates, range of assignments, and influence on results for the work function or program:

Under the limited supervision and direction of the Director Life Sciences, provides management and leadership to Perth Zoo's animal health program, including management of the veterinary hospital and staff, allocation of departmental budget and other resources, veterinary involvement in research and conservation programs and projects, as well as strategic oversight of undergraduate and postgraduate student training. Develops and manages relationships and partnerships within the zoo and with external parties, including within the broader DBCA. Aligns day to day operations with agreed strategies. Provides overall clinical leadership and oversight to the zoo's veterinary program.

Individuals undertake their duties and responsibilities in accordance with the department's <u>Code of Conduct</u>, policies and procedures, and relevant Government legislation.

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4. Responsibilities of the Position and Broad Outline of Duties

Clinical leadership

- 1. Provides overarching supervision and leadership to the provision of an animal health service to Perth Zoo, including management and oversight of the animal hospital, veterinary procedures, and staff.
- 2. Oversees the clinical medicine program and provides direction and guidance on preventative and reactive population and individual health management.
- 3. Coordinates and supervises disease investigation projects.
- 4. Manages the provision of an emergency animal health care service and veterinary response to animal emergencies.
- 5. Leads a program to manage and minimise zoonotic disease risk to staff and public.
- 6. Develops and maintains relationships and partnerships with other institutions, professional groups and individuals in order to maximise the quality of care for animals treated or managed by the department.
- 7. Actively promotes and maintains relationships with local, national and overseas parties, and represents the Zoo as required.

Departmental management

- 8. Manages and supervises training and professional development, performance, planning, conflict resolution and other personnel issues within the veterinary department.
- 9. Provides strategic input into the development and implementation of the operational plan, veterinary aspects of breeding programmes and species management, and animal operations as required.
- 10. Manages and accountable for the veterinary department budget.
- 11. Responsible for maintaining a safe, inclusive, and equitable workplace, where all OSH requirements and other relevant Perth Zoo policies and guidelines are adhered to.
- 12. Creates and promotes a team culture that values diversity and enables people to develop and work effectively together to achieve Perth Zoo's strategic and operational goals.

Research, conservation and training

- 13. Drives research partnerships, and manages research activities, including identifying priority research areas, as relevant to wildlife health matters.
- 14. Provides leadership for and manages veterinary staff involvement in the zoos on site and field conservation projects, as well as in undergraduate and postgraduate veterinary training programmes.

Other

15. Undertakes other duties as directed.

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5. Selection Criteria

In the context of the duties and responsibilities of the position, the following selection criteria apply. All criteria are essential unless specified otherwise.

Applicants should address the following four criteria. These should be addressed in no more than three pages in total.

- Significant demonstrated clinical experience in the provision of veterinary care for wild animals in a zoo or similar environment, including medicine, surgery, disease investigation and chemical restraint of a range of species. It is expected that candidates are residency trained or accumulated experience to the level of board eligibility by the European or American College of Zoological Medicine or equivalent.
- 2. Demonstrated experience in leadership and management, ability to develop, mentor and support a clinical veterinary team, and highly developed written and verbal communication skills.
- 3. Significant demonstrated knowledge of animal husbandry and management practices as it relates to wild animal care in a zoo or similar environment, including breeding, nutrition, biosecurity, animal housing and enclosure design.
- 4. Demonstrated experience and skills in driving research, conservation and/or other collaborative partnerships.

The following essential criteria will be assessed at some stage during the selection process. Desirable criteria will be assessed as required:

- 5. Veterinary degree eligible for registration by the WA Veterinary Surgeons Board to practice veterinary medicine in Western Australia.
- 6. Board certification by the European or American College of Zoological Medicine or equivalent, or other relevant postgraduate training in wildlife health.
- 7. Demonstrated experience in research and/or conservation programs and projects related to Perth Zoo's objectives.
- 8. Demonstrated understanding of occupational health and safety, and equity and diversity principles and practices.
- 9. Knowledge of relevant international, Commonwealth and State wildlife regulations and standards.

Desirable criteria:

- 11. Training in management and/or leadership.
- 12. Experience in working with the media.
- 13. Experience in training and/or supervising undergraduate and/or postgraduate students.
