This position assists in the research and formulation of Government policy initiatives and develops advice on whole of Government matters for consideration by the Premier and Cabinet. In this role you will be supported and mentored by the broader team to increase your knowledge, refine your skills to progress your policy career.

To be successful in this role you will have an inquisitive mind and be highly motivated to contribute to supporting the delivery of high-quality policy outcomes that enable positive change. You will be a team player that can take instruction and apply your research and analytical skills to inform the development and evaluation of evidence-based policy. You will also be able to prepare written communications and deliver your findings in a professional manner.

It also engages with the Australian Government on national security and emergency management matters and services to the Indian Ocean Territories. Exemplifies personal integrity and self-awareness: Demonstrates public service professionalism and probity by adhering to the Code of Conduct. Engages with risk and shows personal courage in providing accurate information. Commits to action by taking responsibility for the completion of work and takes initiative to progress work. Promotes and adopts a positive and balanced approach to work by maintaining effective performance in challenging situations. Demonstrates self-awareness and a commitment to personal development by seeking out opportunities.

Communicates and influences effectively: Communicates clearly and succinctly. Listens, understands, and adapts communication to the audience. Negotiate confidently by gaining understanding of the issues.
