



# **Principal Policy Officer - Level 7**

#### **Role Overview:**

This rewarding and challenging position provides high level policy support and advice and undertakes complex research and analysis in relation to the development, coordination, implementation and review of Government policies from a cross portfolio perspective.

To be successful in this role you will be a strategic thinker that can influence and drive complex high quality, evidence-based policy outcomes. You will draw on your exceptional written and verbal communication skills to establish understanding and achieve results. As an experienced practitioner, you will also mentor and readily share your knowledge and experience with the other members of the team.

### Intergovernmental Relations and Strategic Priorities

This division works closely with the Australian Government and other State and Territories, pursuing the best outcomes for WA in intergovernmental negotiations and discussions. It provides strategic advice and support to the Premier and Cabinet, including for meetings of the National Cabinet. It also engages with the Australian Government on national security and emergency management matters and services to the Indian Ocean Territories. Key priorities for 2023 include:

- Leading the negotiation of Commonwealth funding agreements
- Significant reform agenda, including health system reform, climate action and vocational education and training.
- Developing strategies to counter national security risks such as foreign interference and violent extremism.

## Community Policy

The Community Policy Unit provides policy advice, develops effective partnerships, and provides leadership on strategic, complex, and whole-ofgovernment policy matters to deliver on the Premier and Cabinet's economic and social priorities. The division works across the sector and in national forums to tackle long term social challenges for Western Australians.

Some of the areas that we contribute to include:

- Early Childhood **Education and Care**
- Youth at risk
- Disability
- Community services
- Strategic social policy coordination

### Infrastructure, Economy and Environment

The division leads whole-ofgovernment activities that underpin the State's economy, job creation and delivery of positive social and environmental outcomes for the community.

Within the division, the Economic, **Environment and Industry** directorate provides advice on strategic issues across economic, industry and environment policy, including the State's transition to a low carbon future.

The Infrastructure and the Regions directorate provides advice on the development, planning, prioritisation, delivery and evaluation of the State's strategic infrastructure and regional development initiatives.

- Resources Community Investment Initiative
- Housing

Anticipates and is responsive to internal and external client needs. Consults and shares information and ensures others are kept informed of issues. Works collaboratively and operates as an effective team member.

**Exemplifies personal integrity and self-awareness:** Provides impartial and forthright advice, challenges important issues constructively and can defend own position when challenged. Acknowledges mistakes and learns from them and seeks guidance and advice when required. Adopts a principled approach and adheres to public sector values and Code of Conduct. Operates as an effective representative of the Department in public and internal forums.

**Communicates and influences effectively:** Confidently presents messages in a clear, concise and articulate manner. Selects the most appropriate medium for conveying information and structures written and verbal communication to ensure clarity.
