Engages with risk and shows personal courage when ideas are challenged. Learns from mistakes. Commits to action by taking responsibility for meeting objectives and progressing work. Promotes and adopts a positive and balanced approach to work. Demonstrates self-awareness and a commitment to personal development by self-evaluating performance and seeking out feedback from others.

**Communicates and influences effectively:** Communicates clearly and succinctly. Listens, understands, and adapts communication to the audience. Negotiate confidently and presents persuasive arguments.
