School Context

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Kenwick School is a Government school of choice that teaches students aged 4-19 years, with wide ranging special educational needs. These include severe to profound intellectual disabilities, sensory and physical impairments; as well as other complex medical and behavioural conditions. Our school is a safe, supportive and engaging learning environment that enables students to learn the functional knowledge, coping, life and social skills they require to achieve their full potential.

We accomplish this through a relentless focus on individualised and inclusive learning programs that maximise student achievement. These processes are underpinned by collaborative engagement with our students, their families and other specialists.

Kenwick School pursues an inclusive and holistic approach to achieve positive social, educational, health and well-being outcomes for all students. Several of our students, have highly challenging maladaptive behaviours; some have co-morbid mental health conditions. We continue to develop and refine our strategies in order to foster positive outcomes for all our students. Our Pro-Social Development (PSD) approach differs from traditional behaviour management strategies, in that it strongly focuses on relationships-based guidance to help our students replace maladaptive behaviours with more adaptive or prosocial ones.

In 2024 Kenwick School's expected school enrolment will be more than 85 students with a diverse range of educational needs from early childhood to Year 12.
