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Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. CLINICAL

1.1. In conjunction with the director assumes clinical responsibility primarily for clients of BMHU and also within the community.

- 1.2. In conjunction with the director, evaluates the clinical practice and standards of all BMHU clinical staff in their management of clients.
- 1.3. Interviews, examines diagnoses and treats clients, and interviews their relatives and carers as indicated to ensure best practice.
- 1.4. Participates in multi-disciplinary team meetings and takes the lead role in the discussion of each client's management.
- 1.5. Participates in the after-hours, weekends and public holiday on-call roster in association with the consultant community psychiatrist and clinical director.
- 1.6. Develops and maintain formal links and networks with medical and other staff of the Broome Regional Health Campus, GP's, other inpatient psychiatric facilities in WA, northwest communities and agencies including the Pilbara region.
- 1.7. Advises and assists in the triage of new referrals as required.
- 1.8. Provides consultation and liaison services to hospitals in the region.

2. PROFESSIONAL

- 2.1. Ensures adherence to the current Mental Health Act and Regulations on the part of staff within the BMHU.
- 2.2. Provides supervision training and instruction to both the Psychiatric Registrar and Resident Medical Officer and Medical Students as required.
- 2.3. Participate in professional development including professional supervision, performance management, further education and training and keeping up to date with new developments in Psychiatric practice.
- 2.4. Participates in teaching of the staff of the BMHU.
- 2.5. Participates in service strategic planning and research activities associated with Kimberley Mental Health Drug Service (KMHDS) and BMHU.

3. QUALITY

- 3.1. Provide leadership and participates in clinical governance matters of the BMHU.
- 3.2. Participates in quality management programs and accreditation processes.

4. OTHER

- 4.1. Supports the philosophy of KMHDS and the BMHU.
- 4.2. Other duties as directed by line manager or their delegate.
- 4.3. Provides supervision to the Psychiatry Liaison Nurses and provides consultation and Liaison services to Broome Emergency Department and General Hospital.
- 4.4. Provides supervision for the RANZCP trainees working in the inpatient unit and in the consultation and liaison rotations.

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Work Related Requirements

- 6 Experience and ability to work effectively in a multidisciplinary team.
- 7 Demonstrated effective written, verbal and interpersonal communication skills.
- 8 Current C Class drivers Licence.

Desirable

- 1 Knowledge of or experience working with Aboriginal people impacted by mental health conditions and have an understanding of the related practical and emotional issues of working with Aboriginal consumers with comorbidity mental health /alcohol and drug disorders and unresolved trauma.
- 2 Administrative skills and Experience and/or interest in teaching, research and supervision.
- 3 Current knowledge and commitment to Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health in all aspects of employment and service delivery.
