Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. Clinical

- 1.1. Provides advanced and autonomous expert midwifery care to women, babies and families in accordance with the scope of practice of the Endorsed Midwife by:
 - Assessment and diagnosis
 - Prescribing medications
 - Ordering and analysing pathology and imaging tests
 - Referring women and babies to other Health Professionals as per the Australian College of Midwives National Guidelines for Midwifery Consultation and Referral within own scope of practice.
- 1.2. Ensures compliance with relevant Federal/State legislation, DoH and WACHS policies, and local procedures as they pertain to the delivery of health services.
- 1.3. Analyses the research to determine clinical and management trends, initiates and implements best practice that supports the delivery of appropriate midwifery care and management.
- 1.4. Maintains excellence in interpersonal skills and leadership to guide appropriate midwifery care.
- 1.5. Promotes and guides a multi-disciplinary team approach to decision making.
- 1.6. Provides midwifery care and documents with regard to risk management principles.

2. Governance, Safety and Quality

- 2.1. Promote effective clinical leadership.
- 2.2. Supports a working environment conducive to open communication and constructive problem solving.
- 2.3. Develop and promote positive relations with clients, peers, medical staff, allied health colleagues and members of the general public.
- 2.4. Participate in peer review and case review procedures as determined by their line manager.
- 2.5. Participates in relevant committees and special projects, including the development and coordination of the proposed Midwifery Group Practice at Karratha Health Campus
- 2.6. Contribute to staff and patient safety systems that meet contemporary clinical standards and OS&H requirements.
- 2.7. Liaise with other agencies and organisations as required.
- 2.8. Promote cost-effective use of materials.
- 2.9. Provide leadership in coordinating and implementing quality improvement activities specific to the Endorsed Midwife role.
- 2.10. Participate in Clinical Practice Improvement Programs and Clinical Governance Initiatives as relevant to practice.
- 2.11. Identify opportunities to improve and promote evidence based clinical practice.
- 2.12. Ensure maternity services are provided in a manner sensitive to, and appropriate for, people of Indigenous and other cultural backgrounds.

3. Education and Training

- 3.1. Contribute to Health Service workforce development programs and seek opportunities for ongoing professional education of self and colleagues.
- 3.2. Maintains own clinical skills and disseminates clinical and leadership knowledge and skills.
- 3.3. Acts as one of the unit's clinical leads, providing support and education to team members, mentors and oversees novice team members, and assists in driving the culture of professional development for all midwifery staff.
- 3.4. Participates in clinical research activities where applicable.
