Role summary

Under limited direction, this position will lead and coordinate evidence-based advice and forecasts on economic and social conditions for the Kimberley region. With the capabilities of a broadly recognised professional, this position provides high level economic research and analysis and policy advice that contributes to the economic development and wellbeing of the Kimberley region.

About us

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development's (DPIRD) role is to ensure that primary industries and regions are key contributors to the Government's agenda for economic growth and diversification, job creation, strong communities and better places. Our goals are to:

Key responsibilities

Policy Advice

- Undertakes research and analysis of quantitative and qualitative data to assess information, analyse trends and develop an evidence base (measured and modelled) to inform advice and decision-making.
- Coordinates the development, writing and production of public reports on key economic topics related to the development of the Kimberley region.
- Writes briefing notes on key economic topics related to the Kimberley region.
- Works collaboratively across the Regional Development portfolio, and across Government and external stakeholders to prepare information, analysis and advice on regional development issues generally, as part of coordinated statewide priorities.
- Manages, supervises and develops other team members to achieve strategic outcomes on designated project teams.
- Develops and improves economic models to provide a critical basis for analysis and advice.
- Provides input to the assessment of performance indicators reported by the Department and Commission.

- Reviews and publishes in a variety of media, including journals, to communicate insights of particular relevance to the development of the Kimberley.
- Publishes work in relevant journals.
- Assists in attracting additional funding, where appropriate.

Stakeholder Engagement

- Promotes holistic achievement of regional development goals through close cooperation with regional businesses, industry bodies, local government, Aboriginal Traditional Owners and organisations, and other regional leadership bodies.
- Represents the Department and Commission on committees, working parties or inquiries as required.
- Where appropriate, collaborates with other groups or disciplines and contributes to the sharing of information and skills within the economics, business and policy disciplines.
- Directs the work of specialist consultants and assists in the preparation of project specifications as required.

General

- Undertakes emergency response duties as required.
- Oversees budgets, teamwork, quality control, production and communication of key economic projects.
- Supervises support staff as required.
- Cooperates and collaborates with staff from other organisations.
- Contributes to project planning processes.
- Applies risk management to all business processes.
- Other duties as required.
