Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. CLINICAL

- 1.4. Plans, implements and evaluates nursing care, health promotion and education sessions to within schools and also to individual families and groups according to need and service priorities, involving multidisciplinary teams where required.
- 1.5. Provides a quality service according to clinical governance guidelines and best practice and participates in identification and development of service based quality improvement activities.
- 1.6. Participates in immunisation programs when required.
- 1.7. Teaches and mentors nursing students, colleagues and others within scope of practice.

- 2.1. Provides formal reports and data as per health service requirements and maintains appropriate documentation.
- 2.2. Communicates and liaises effectively with the Clinical Nurse Manager-Community Health and the health team about service delivery or service planning issues.
