Role summary

Coordinates and conducts research and analysis of complex information and data evaluation to support the planning and implementation of community and economic development projects.

Undertakes projects independently and assists with coordination of more complex projects.

About us

Key responsibilities

The key responsibilities of the role include, but are not limited to, the following:

Project Management

- Undertakes complex research and/or economic impact analysis and provides subject matter expert advice and recommendations on the current and future management of risks, emerging issues and trends impacting the development and implementation of the Commission's regional development strategies, plans, policies and projects.
- Identifies organisations with direct investment potential and trade opportunities in the Region.
- Identifies and works with proponents, investors and trade partners to secure new investment into the Region.
- Prepares and coordinates reports, submissions, briefings, correspondence and advice of major regional projects and proposals to the executive management team and the Board, also draft Ministerial and Executive correspondence as required.
- Provides analysis and due diligence assessments on business cases and economic development projects undertaken in the region, develop relevant evaluation methodology and provide professional advice and solutions to address issues that will affect performance indicators and/or milestones.

- Facilitates the development and implementation of industry and business strategies and plans, in partnership with relevant government agencies and private sector, to ensure the development and implementation of complex project outcomes.
- Develops and facilitates projects that enhance the development of the region, including community development, economic diversification, land, accommodation, infrastructure to also increase local employment through the growth and development of local business.
- Prepares and undertakes the research, development and compilation of project plans including investigations, feasibility studies, tender processes and project costs.
- Coordinates the management and implementation of project plans to achieve the implementation of outcomes detailed in the Commission's Strategic Plan including the prioritising and allocation of resources and the delivery of outcomes within agreed parameters, e.g. time, cost, quality.
- Conducts research, analysis, due diligence, input, updates and reports for current and new or potential regional grant programs.
- Mentors, coaches and support all staff across the Region as required.
- Contributes to the preparation of advice to the Board.

Client and Stakeholder Engagement

- Monitors consultants and contractors to ensure government objectives and deliverables are met efficiently and effectively.
- Works collaboratively with Communications and other relevant Corporate areas to promote regional development projects, publicly address specific issues and providing promotional and other information to the public.
- Prepares and directs staff in the preparation of submissions and responses to ministerial, parliamentary questions and briefing notes.
- Liaises with Commonwealth, State and Local Government, community bodies and industry sector groups on matters related to the region.
- Proactively builds and manages strategic partnerships and communication networks with internal and external clients and stakeholders to ensure that regional development issues and projects are dealt with in a coordinated and integrated manner.
- Represents the Commission at industry forums, committees and working groups as required and organises and conducts meetings.
- Maintains and manages a network of contacts and strong collaborative relationships across regional communities, business and industry, relevant Federal, State and Local Government agencies, prospective investors and trade partners to pursue investment opportunities.
- Leads and participates in the development of emergency response capacity (e.g. people, system, infrastructure, etc.) for this function in a large scale emergency requiring a coordinated response.
- Participates in incident and emergency management activities commensurate with capability capacity, training and level of experience.
- Other duties as required.

Role specific

1. Demonstrated high level experience in project/program management, including the ability to formulate, analyse and complete due diligence on business and industry project proposals by applying business principles, financial analysis and assessment of risk.

Core capabilities

- 2. Build effective relationships: Well developed communication skills (written, verbal and interpersonal), with the ability to liaise and consult with a range of clients and stakeholders on various levels internal and external to the organisation.
- **3.** Challenge for innovation: Proven ability to rigorously evaluate available information through research and analysis and apply innovative thinking in forming solutions which produce best possible outcomes.
- 4. *Think strategically:* Proven ability to think strategically, research and analyse issues and apply innovative solutions to complex problems.
- 5. *Deliver in a changing environment:* Proven ability to self-motivate, utilise initiative to anticipate requirements and resolve problems arising from competing and changing demands and priorities, delivering within tight timelines and be flexible in approach.
- 6. *Lead and empower others:* Demonstrated ability to work autonomously and to work effectively within a team environment, involving and recognising others contributions.

Desirable criteria

1. Experience working in regional Australia and broad understanding and ability to contextualise past and current social, economic and political issues impacting on the work of the Commission
