Exclusive support for nurses and midwives

- ✓ Between \$5,000 and \$17,000 in support over 12 months at select locations
- ✓ Up to \$12,000 in HECS-HELP support for newly qualified nurses and midwives
- ✓ Up to \$10,000 relocation assistance if you're moving to WA from overseas or \$8,000 from interstate



Assistance with living expenses

- ✓ District travel and accommodation subsidies – including subsidised rent
- ✓ District allowances specifically for the Pilbara
- ✓ Air-conditioning subsidy available
- ✓ Generous salary packaging benefits:
 - Up to \$9,010 on everyday living expenses like mortgage or rent
 - Up to \$2,650 on meals, entertainment, holiday accommodation and venue hire
 - Novated leasing to use pre-tax dollars to purchase a car and expenses
