How to apply

You will be asked to submit a written application and up-to-date CV. It is important that you read the job advertisement carefully to ensure you meet all the application requirements, including adherence to page limits.

Step 1: Submitting your application

The following paperwork must be submitted for assessment to be considered eligible for the 2025 Graduate Program.

- Evidence of Australian citizenship or Australian permanent residency.
- A copy of your most recent academic transcript.
- A current CV (maximum 3 pages) outlining your work experience, achievements, extra-curricular involvements and/or leadership roles you have undertaken, including details of two (2) referees.
- A two-page written application telling us about:
- Why you want to work at DPC.
- Your skills and attributes that will be relevant to the role (including your analytical
 and research skills, communication and interpersonal skills, how you prioritise
 your work and meet deadlines as well as your experience working in a team
 environment). Be sure to use examples from your university, work, volunteering,
 internships, or personal experiences.

Once you have put together all the above, apply online through the **WA.Gov.au Jobs search page** by clicking the **'Apply for Job'** button on the advertisement

You will be asked to answer a number of questions which will determine your suitability for the role. It is strongly recommended you allow plenty of time to prepare and submit your application online.

Applications must be lodged by 4:00pm on Monday, 2 September 2024. Late applications will not be accepted.

Important: If you don't provide the above required documentation with your application, you will not meet the eligibility requirements and will not proceed to the next step in the recruitment process.



Step 2: In-person interview

As part of the interview process, you will be asked to complete a written exercise and take part in a short panel interview.



Step 3 : Referee checks and notification to applicants

Following the interviews, references will be sought for candidates deemed suitable and employment offers will be finalised in October. Successful applicants will commence in February 2025. If you are unsuccessful in the process, you will be emailed and given the opportunity to seek feedback from the panel at the end of the selection process.

Eligibility

Qualifications

Applications are invited from university graduates who have successfully completed a degree between 1 June 2022 and 31 December 2024. Relevant qualifications include, but are not limited to the following academic disciplines:

Public policy, Politics, International Relations, Law, Legal Studies, Commerce, Arts, Economics, Indigenous and Communities Studies, Management, Finance, HR and Strategic Communications.

Applicants with qualifications obtained outside Australia are responsible for ensuring these are assessed by the Overseas Qualifications Unit within the Department of Training and Workforce Development.

Eligibility to work in Australia

To be eligible for the program, applicants must be an Australian citizen or an Australian permanent resident at the time of application.

Criminal Record Screening

Successful applicants will be required to undertake the Department's criminal screening process. A previous criminal conviction or pending charges will not necessarily preclude employment but will be taken into account in assessing suitability for employment.
