#### KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Provide specialist support in the implementation of policy and strategy for prioritising and funding road and/or bridge infrastructure investment proposals on the State road network. Prepare draft documentation to support road and/or bridge infrastructure investment planning and budget processes, including funding submissions. Provide specialist support in the preparation and periodic review of Main Roads' Strategic Asset Plan.

#### **Investment Planning and Evaluation and Governance Systems**

Provide specialist support in the following:

- implementation of policy and strategy for prioritising and funding infrastructure investment proposals on the State road network
- preparation of documentation to support infrastructure investment planning and budget processes, including funding submissions
- assessment of road asset/network performance against defined measures and criteria to prioritise future infrastructure investment proposals and support the development of unfunded programs
- evaluating infrastructure investment proposals, drawing on cost estimates, economic and financial analysis
- data analysis to support the prioritisation and programming of infrastructure investment proposals
- managing crucial information to support reporting and decision making in relation to infrastructure investment planning
- various research, including into government priorities, strategic drivers and potential prioritisation methods, to inform infrastructure investment priorities and support process improvements
- preparation and periodic review of Main Roads Strategic Asset Plan
- Provide advice and support to Main Roads staff in infrastructure investment planning systems, practices and products.
- Implement identified improvement actions to work processes and procedures within the Branch.

#### Stakeholder Relationships

- Build and enhance collaborative relationships with internal and external stakeholders e.g., Regional Offices, members of investment planning committees.
- Liaise with internal and external stakeholders to assist facilitating infrastructure investment prioritisation and funding.
- Liaise with internal and external stakeholders to assist the understanding of Main Roads investment planning processes.
