## Role summary

Under immediate or general direction, provides routine and general assistance to senior officers in the areas of field or laboratory research. Undertakes a range of simple and routine laboratory, field and site work using established procedures and/or techniques.

## About us

## Key responsibilities

The key responsibilities of the role include, but are not limited to, the following:

### Research and Development

- Provides assistance in field, glasshouse and laboratory experiments by carrying out routine experimental, survey, sampling and analytical tasks.
- Records, tabulates, and checks routine research and surveys.
- Follows procedures and prepares routine samples for routine laboratory quality testing.
- Assists with the collation and routine analysis of research and survey data.
- Undertakes routine maintenance of laboratory and experimental equipment used in research projects.
- Operates and maintains agricultural machinery and assists with the maintenance of experimental equipment.

### Communication and Liaison

- Maintains networks with officers in own project/operation/location and develops relationships across projects / operations/ locations.
- Supports communication and industry development activities by assisting with the presentation on the application of established technical practices.

- Arranges meetings, field days and demonstrations as required.
- Attends to customer enquiries on routine technical and inspection enquiries.
- Attends to customer grievances on routine technical and inspection enquiries according to policy and procedure, and escalates more complex matters.

## **General**

- Assists with the supervision and training of Technical Assistant and casual staff as required.
- Assists in the preparation of cost estimates for different components of the research, diagnostic, inspection and extension activities and, orders supplies and equipment, as required.
- Participates in the implementation and evaluation of procedures and operations.
- Under direction, works with pesticides and other hazardous substances in accordance with standard safety procedures and guidelines.
- Undertakes emergency response duties as required.
- Participates in biosecurity incident response activities commensurate with capability, capacity, training and level of experience.
- Other duties as required.

1. Knowledge and experience in agricultural practices, research techniques and methods.

#### **Core capabilities**

2. *Build effective relationships*: Good written, verbal and interpersonal communication skills, including the ability to liaise internal stakeholders and the ability to document processes and prepare reports.
3. *Challenge for innovation*: Ability to contribute to the development of research plans and methods.
4. *Think strategically*: Ability to apply conceptual, analytical and problem solving skills to resolve identified issues.
5. *Deliver in a changing environment*: Ability to prioritise and complete tasks within deadlines.
6. *Lead and empower others*: Ability to work autonomously and in a team environment.

### **Desirable criteria**

1. Bachelor degree in relevant discipline or equivalent experience

### Special requirements/equipment

- Certificate in a relevant discipline with some experience or a considerable level of relevant experience.
- Undertaking field work away from the base location for periods up to a working week may be required.
- Working outside normal hours to complete seasonal tasks may be required.
- Living in regional/semi-remote community may be required.
- An acceptable National Police Certificate (police clearance) is required (if not currently held, must be acquired prior to commencement at applicants' expense).
- A current and valid Western Australian "C" or "C-A" class (car) drivers' license or equivalent is required (if not currently held must be acquired prior to commencement at applicant's expense).
- Occasional travel to and from metropolitan and regional offices may be required.
- The contract of employment specifies terms and conditions relating to this position.
- DPIRD is an Emergency Management Agency and all employees may be required to work or travel during, or outside of, normal business hours to assist with incidents and emergencies.
