The Pilbara Population Health Directorate provides several Community Health services including: Immunisation and Child Health clinics, Allied Health and Public Health services including disease control, sexual health and health promotion. There are several sites serviced by Population Health staff throughout the Pilbara region including Port Hedland, Newman, Yandeyarra, Tom Price, Karratha, Onslow, Pannawonica, Paraburdoo and Roebourne. Outreach work is also conducted to remote Aboriginal communities in the Western Desert.

Pilbara Population Health is a multidisciplinary team of Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Social Workers, Speech Pathologists, Dietitians, Allied Health Assistants, Community nurses, Public Health clinicians and Health Promotion staff, that work together to provide community nursing, allied health, public health and health promotion services to the community.



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Key Duties/Responsibilities

1. COMMUNITY PRACTICE

1.1 Provide quality Primary Health Care to individuals, families and the general community to meet planned health outcomes according to primary health care principles and program priorities.

- 1.2 Plans service provision to individuals, families and the wider community in relation to priority programs.
- 1.3 Plans, implements and evaluates evidence based health promotion and education to individuals, families and the wider community according to program priorities and client needs.
- 1.4 Maintains relevant clinical and service documentation, including statistical data collection in accordance with statutory and departmental requirements.
- 1.5 Work in partnership with families and key community stakeholders in delivering health programs to achieve desirable health outcomes including planning and service delivery of programs relating to communicable disease, sexual health, mental health, women, children and men's health.
- 1.6 Provides culturally appropriate and non-judgemental nursing care, health promotion and education to individuals, families and the community within a partnership model.
- 1.7 Provides immunisation services to the community.

2. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 Maintain competency to practice in accordance with national competency standards for the Registered Nurse as described by the Australian Health Practitioners Regulation Agency.
- 2.2 Responsible for own professional development and competency in line with clinical competency for Community Health Nurses.
- 2.3 Participate in a multi-disciplinary approach to service delivery, liaising with colleagues and other agencies and organisations as required.
- 2.4 Participate in quality assurance, performance management and demonstrates leadership in developing the service in line with Quality Assurance standards.
- 2.5 Promotes the safety of the client, self and others through the incorporation of Occupational Health and Safety standards into their own health practice.

- 3. Knowledge of current legislative obligations for Equal Opportunity, Disability Services and Occupational Safety and Health, and how these impact on employment and service delivery.
