Position Overview

The Clinical Nurse Consultant-Oncology Coordination (Urology) position is funded through a partnership with the McGrath Foundation. This position provides care, information, and support for people with urological cancer across the continuity of care pathways and multidisciplinary teams in the community and within remote Health Services. The role provides advanced clinical urology cancer nursing knowledge with a WACHS wide remit for uro-oncology services. The position demonstrates leadership and role modelling and promotes the maintenance of clinical standard setting and monitoring, policy development and change management to improve the urology cancer patient's journey.

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Key Duties/Responsibilities

- 1. The role provides leadership that facilitates the ongoing development of clinical practice that reflects the McGrath Model of Care.
- 2. Provides governance in the coordination of urology clinics and remote and regional services. Works collaboratively with urology multi-disciplinary teams, ensuring the needs of the regional patient are met and service planning can be optimised through a clear understanding of local context.
- 3. Provides clinical leadership to medical, nursing and allied health professionals in urology cancer care, contributes enhanced access to new services, and facilities and develops partnerships with other service providers.
- 4. Provides advanced and complex patient urology cancer care, advice and direction.
- 5. Initiates and analyses research to determine clinical best practice; that supports the delivery of appropriate urology cancer care, inclusive of auditing and reporting.
- 6. Maintains excellence in interpersonal skills and use of leadership to guide appropriate patient care and service delivery, maintaining strong communication with the network of urology cancer nurses.
- 7. Promotes and facilitates a multidisciplinary team approach to decision making inclusive of the promotion and support of Telehealth and care close to home.
- 8. Develops innovative techniques for complex problem solving for urology cancer services, and culturally responsive treatment strategies to improve outcomes.
- 9. Develops, implements and promotes evidence-based standards and polices that are compliant with relevant professional, industrial and legislative requirements.
- 10. Provides leadership in the coordination and implementation of quality improvement and patient safety activities and uses audit results to guide and support change in practice.
- 11. Contributes to the formulation of staffing profiles, according to analysis of clinical cancer needs and operates within the allocated/available budget for cancer services.
- 12. Actively participates in the recruitment, selection and orientation of staff as required.
- 13. Develops and implements business plans and strategies that facilitate effective utilisation of human, financial and physical resources consistent with WACHS strategic plans.
- 14. Provides clinical information, statistics and reports as required by WACHS, State and National Committees.
- 15. Implements and maintains performance management systems which support the ongoing development of staff.
- 16. Develops, implements and evaluates education and training programs inclusive of new and emerging treatment regimens related to the area of uro-oncology.
- 17. Provides a public relations function for the area including investigation and management of ministerial, enquires and patient complaints and compliments.
- 18. Use effective change management strategies to improve urology cancer nursing practice.
- 19. Responsible and accountable for attendance of self to mandatory training programs during a twelvemonth period.
- 20. Other duties as required.



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Work Related Requirements

- 1. Eligibility for registration in the category of Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.
- 2. Demonstrate a proven successful record of professional clinical leadership, experience and advanced clinical practice and knowledge in cancer services.
- Demonstrated advanced interpersonal, communication (written and verbal), negotiation and change management skills.
- 4. Well-developed analytical and problem-solving skills.
- 5. Demonstrated knowledge and experience of clinical governance systems, and in the application of research and best practice principles.
- 6. Demonstrated digital capability across clinical systems and platforms that contribute to cancer control activities, data collection and reporting.
- 7. Current C or C-A Class drivers license

Desirable

- 1. Possession of or significant progression toward the attainment of a post graduate qualification in area of speciality.
- 2. Demonstrated knowledge of health issues relevant to rural and remote communities.
- 3. Understanding of preceptoring, orientation and clinical teaching programs
