About the Role

Working independently and with other research, technical, operational, and policy staff, undertake research and provide technical advice to support fire and conservation management across WA. Apply spatial and statistical modelling, field survey and experimental approaches to study: fire risk, behaviour, regimes, severity, outcomes and effects; contemporary and cultural burning; and decision support tools.

Individuals undertake their duties and responsibilities in accordance with the department's <u>Code of Conduct</u>, policies and procedures, and relevant Government legislation.

Note: For this role, we consider fire science to include study of fire regimes, fire behaviour, fire management, fire risk, fire effects, and related subjects.

'SC2' and 'SC3' refer to Specified Calling appointment Level 2, and Level 3, respectively.

- 1. BSc or equivalent qualification in a discipline relevant to fire science (PhD DESIRABLE).
- 2. Experience (SC2), or extensive experience (SC3), in designing and undertaking research in a discipline relevant to fire science, and; demonstrated (SC2) or demonstrated high level (SC3) understanding of fire science principles.
- 3. Demonstrated relevant analytical skills and technical capability (e.g. GIS, remote sensing, statistics, modelling) (SC2/SC3), and significant experience in applying these in a research setting (SC3).
- 4. Communication skills across a range of media and settings, including ability to publish scientific findings, translate technical information to diverse audiences, and develop plain language summaries for operational and general audiences (SC2) and technical and policy advice (SC3).

The following essential criteria will be assessed at some stage during the selection process. Desirable criteria will be assessed as required:

5. Experience working effectively with diverse stakeholders and teams

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- 6. Experience in planning and safely undertaking field-based research programs covering OHS, logistics, data, personnel (e.g., technical officers, students, volunteers, colleagues) and communications including in remote or challenging environments.
- 7. Experience and training in use of 4WD (DESIRABLE)
- 8. Ongoing willingness and ability to participate in fire management activities that contribute to bushfire suppression and prescribed burning operations commensurate with capability, capacity, training and level of experience.
