How to Apply

To apply for the 2026 Graduate Development Program, applicants will have completed a **relevant Bachelor** degree recently, or will complete their studies by the end of 2025.

To be considered for the Graduate Development Program, please attach the following:

- A current CV including two references (work-related or university lecturer); and
- A copy of your recent academic transcript for all relevant qualifications (used to verify your WAM).

At the application form stage you will be asked to state **why you are applying** for this program.

Applicants who are short listed for further assessment will be asked to undertake psychometric testing. Course Weighted Average Marks (WAM's) and psychometric testing results will be assessed as part of the application process so please ensure you attach your academic transcript.

Although preference will be given to candidates who are Australian permanent residents or are Australian/New Zealand citizens, we may consider candidates who possess temporary working visas. Temporary working visas must allow you to reside and work full time in Australia for the term of the program.

Please ensure you allow plenty of time to lodge your application as **late, pro forma or emailed applications will not be accepted.**

This selection process will initially be used to fill the above vacancy. Applicants assessed as suitable during this selection process may be considered for other similar vacancies that occur for up to 12 months.

The PTA recognises the benefits of a diverse workforce and encourage women and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to apply.
